





This year the merchants and businesses of Georgetown, Acton and area have been most generous with their donations. We have a lineup of over 260 items that command a retail value of more than \$78,000. The wide range of items include: pizzas to catering, roller blades to a convertible, and a mower to a chain saw. A complete listing of the items is published in "Halton Hills This Week" today and will also run Saturdays.

Also, the Milton Shoppers News will carry the list Friday. Remember to save the list for auction night. Watch Halton Cable 4 to view the auction and items, bids can be placed by calling 853-5990. We have eight lines to serve you.

The Kinsmen Club of Georgetown is a young men's service club dedicated to Serving the Community's Greatest Need. The club recently celebrated it's 35th anniversary and has 35 active members. The Kinsmen's national charity is Cystic Fibrosis.

Cystic Fibrosis is a disease of the respiratory system that attacks thousands of children every year. Life expectancy of children with cystic fibrosis has recently been extended into the 20's, through research sponsored by Kinsmen. Local support is given to such organizations like the Open Door, the Food Bank, the Red Cross and The Cancer Society.

The Kinsmen club is responsible for the batting cage at the fairgrounds and the paper shredder at Wastewise. The Kinsmen sponsor the Kinsmen Girl's Softball League and support many other sports organizations including the Bluefins Swimming Club and Association. Here's how the Auction works. The prize list is split up into eight, 30-minute time blocks. Starting at 6 p.m., the first block will be auctioned off. Viewers may call on one of the eight phone lines we have established. Your bid is received and recorded. The highest bid wins. The Kinsmen club reserves the right to hold items over from one block to another. Be sure to bid early to avoid phone tie ups.

Please bid at least 50% of the value of the item, phone often and bid high. Once a time block has been closed, the successful bidders will be called to confirm the bid and get the payment and delivery details. We will accept VISA and Mastercard, so have your cards ready.

Delivery will be made Tuesday evening, have your payment ready.

Our major auction items are a Ford Aerostar from Park Lincoln Mercury, A VW Golf Cabriolet convertible from Autohaus Georgetown, a Compaq SLT laptop computer from Compaq Canada and a Seadoo from Outdoor Power and Equipment. These items can be bid on at any time during the auction. If you are interested, contact the dealer this week and take a look. Call in your bids, you may be surprised at the deal you make.
