The man drove to Ninth Line, where he abandoned the car and stole another. He returned to the Albert St. residence and drove repeatedly into another car. and driving with a disqualified rent boyfriend. The second stolen car was then abandoned and found by police several hours later.

#### Tips for barbecue use

It is important to use common sense when lighting or transporting your barbecue. Every year, people are injured needlessly while lighting their barbecue. Follow the manufacturer's instructions, open the lid and have the match or lighter already burning before you turn on the propane.

Always use and store your gas barbecue and any propane cylinders outdoors. When you are finished barbecuing, make sure you turn off the barbecue burners and the propane cylinder valves.

Transport propane cylinders in an upright position with the valve plugs in place, ensuring good ventilation. The best way to transport a cylinder is to place it inside a stable container in the trunk of your vehicle. The trunk lid should be secured with a device which will allow it to remain partially open. The rear floor passenger side of your vehicle can be used, providing the cylinder is secured and the rear windows are open.

Ensure the cylinder valve is completely turned off and the valve plug is in place whenever the cylinder is not connected to an appliance.
