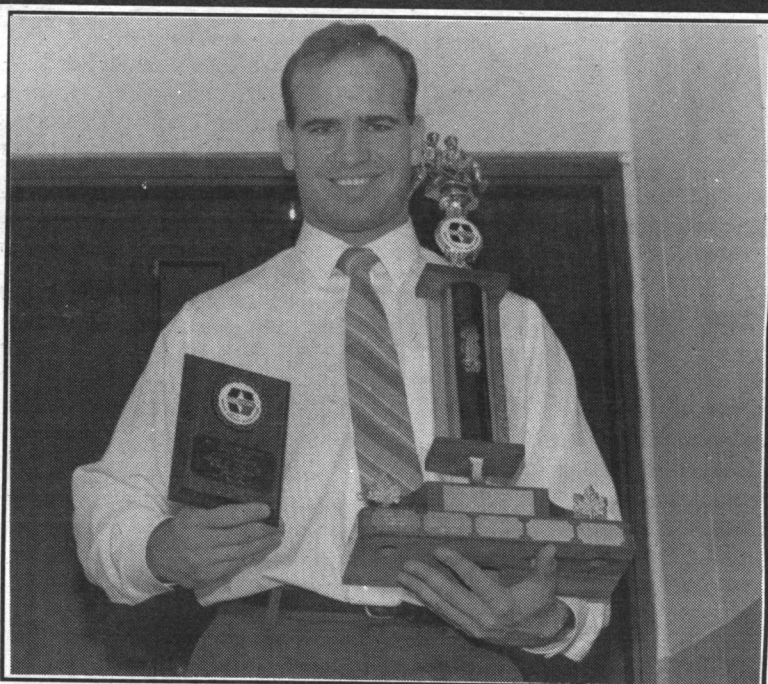


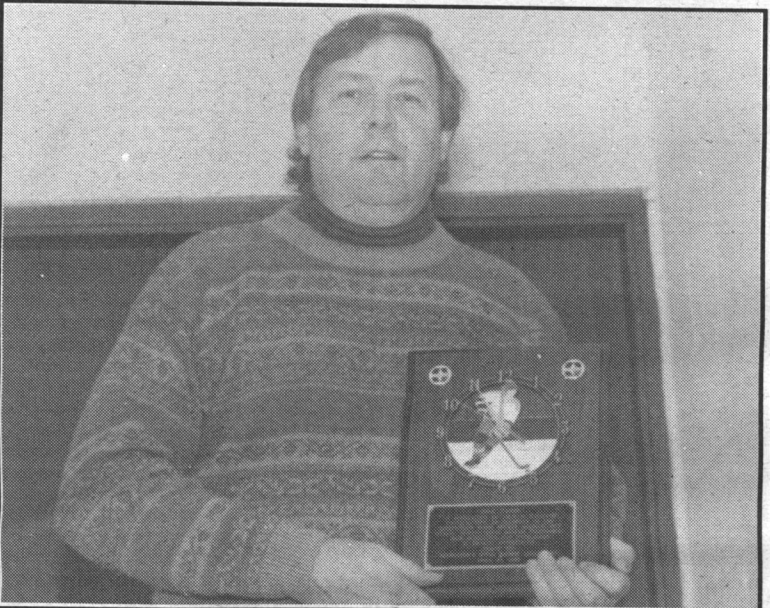
Georgetown Minor Hockey Award Winners

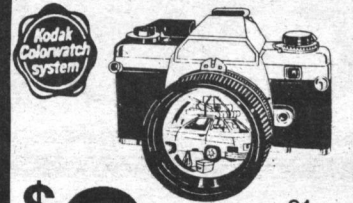

Golfers... DID YOU KNOW?

GOLF BALL ROUNDUP (What every golfer wants to know about the golf ball)

1. What are X-outs - Balls with a row of Xs over the brand name usually are first quality balls rejected for cosmetic reasons - bad inking, off colour paint etc.
2. What happens if a ball has no dimples - The ball won't fly very far. Dimples are what give the ball lift, getting it up in the air for carry. In a USGA test a dimpled ball carried about 260 yards off the drive while a dimpleless ball carried only 150 yards.
3. Does the bounce test tell me anything - No. Many golfers swear that dropping two balls on concrete to see which bounces higher will tell them which will travel further. Because of the low velocity there is no correlation to how the balls will react off the club face.
4. Are balls affected by hot & cold weather - Higher compression (100) balls seem to lose some distance in the colder weather and lower compression (90 and 80) balls seem to lose some distance in the hotter weather. Try using lower compression balls in the colder weather and higher compression balls in hotter weather.
5. How long is a ball good for - When properly stored (room temperature) at least two years. However, if a ball has a bad crease or smile it won't travel as far and should be discarded.
6. What's inside a golf ball - In a wound three piece ball the core is a rubber centre about one inch in diameter. Most balata covered wound balls have hollow cores filled with water and an ingredient like salt for weight. Surlyn covered wound balls usually have solid rubber cores. Around the cores of wound balls are wrapped some 30 yards of rubber thread stretched 10 times its original length. The lighter the winding the higher the balls compression. Most two piece balls have a surlyn cover around a centre about one and a half inches in diameter. These centres are a synthetic rubber, but each manufacturer's formula is different and affects how the ball feels. Contrary to popular opinion a golf ball will not explode if you cut it open.

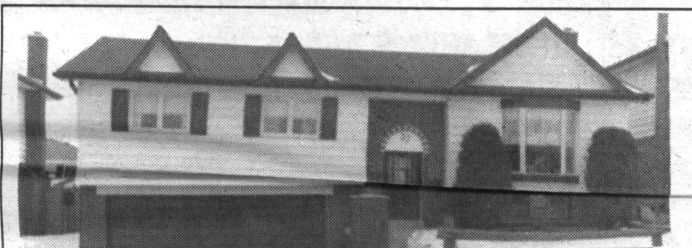
