Klipper Wilco leads the way

After another dominant effort in the second leg of the Princess Pacing Series, Klipper Wilco firmly stamped herself as the one to beat in the upcoming \$53,000 final tomorrow (Sunday).

The three-year-old Laag filly was most impressive in cruising to a 1:56 victory for driver Chris Christoforou, Jr. in one of two divisions last Sunday. It was her second consecutive win in the series. "She's come back very strong this year," said Christoforou, Jr. whose father, Chris, Sr. handles the training duties for owners Frank Colville and John Vanderwerf.

After being parked on the outside until past the opening quarter of :27.4, Klipper Wilco took charge and kept daylight between herself and the rest of the field for the rest of the way. On Fire Again finished second and Her Own Boss closed to be third.

The second division produced one of the most exciting finishes of the spring with six fillies finishing within 1-1/4 lengths of one another. Anita's Heiress, who was ninth at the half mile mark, stormed past the leaders in the stretch to post the narrow win for driver Ron Henderson in a time of 1:57. The daughter of Nihilator edged out pace-setter Tour de France and Balloonist.

"She showed a lot of ability last year (10 wins in 16 starts)," said Henderson. "She got roughed up last week so I was just hoping to get a good cheque tonight and make the final." Trainer Paul St. Pierre co-owns Anita's Heiress with Pamela Chevalier of Dearborn, Michigan.
