Police replace faulty breathalyzers

The ALERT J3A breathalyzer screening devices, which were recalled by Halton Regional Police Service two weeks ago, were replaced on the weekend by the Alco-sur model.

Constable Steve Martin, of the regional Traffic Marine Unit, stated there are now enough approved

screening devices to effectively to discontinue the use of the cover the region.

During the last two weeks, Georgetown 11 Division operated without any breathalyzers. The entire region of Halton operated with three (as opposed to 18.)

ALERT J3A roadside screening device. The breathalyzers were removed following a warning by the federal government that the readings could be faulty.

Georgetown 11 Division Staff Sgt. Don Croucher explained that during the two weeks, the lack of breathalyzers was inconvenient, but "they weren't really needed." Police officers used their discretion in deciding whether a driver was sufficiently intoxicated to be brought in to the police station for a breathalyzer.

"They (breathalyzers) should be used infrequently anyway," claimed Sgt. Joe Martin, media relations officer for the Halton Regional Police Service. "They should only be used if an officer is unsure whether the driver is intoxicated. Usually they can tell."

Const. Steve Martin explained that all of the Alco-sur models in stock were distributed throughout the region. Although there was not a sufficient amount to entirely replace the 18 approved screening devices, they will be fully replaced "in the immediate future."

Police Beat Spiteful relationship

A Georgetown man who left his car for 10 minutes at the North Halton Golf Club in Georgetown Sunday evening, returned to find the entire length of his car scratched. Damage was estimated at \$1,000. According to a police report, the victim's brother says he saw his brother's ex-girlfriend leave the parking lot at approximately the same time. The report further stated the two have a violent history. Police are continuing their investigation.

Injured good Samaritan

Friday afternoon, a Georgetown youth councillor intervened in an assault between a brother and sister, and as a result, was attacked herself. A 17-year-old Georgetown boy has been charged with two counts of assault under the Young Offenders Act.

Unpaid groceries

The men left \$336.15 worth of groceries behind. Police have a description of the men and their car, and are continuing with their investigation.
