New OPSTF president

The Halton District Public School Teachers Federation recently elected a new president at its annual meeting. He is Bert Radford, currently principal of Maple Grove Public School in Oakville.

This is the first time a principal has been elected to the office as a full-time President. He was opposed by two teachers, Merv Sheppard, from Brookdale School in Oakville and Martin Taylor, from Brookville School in Milton. Radford won a majority on the first ballot.

Radford has been a teacher in Halton for 22 years and was a principal at Mohawk Gardens Public School in Burlington and Montclair Public School in Oakville before going to Maple Grove.

He said, "The teachers of Halton have shown they want to cooperate with the Board of Education and they understand that restraint is necessary. However, they cannot allow the strength of the profession, built by many years of responsible bargaining in good times, to be eroded in a few difficult years."

Radford will replace the incumbent president, Bill Barrett, who will return to a classroom in Halton.





LINEN - CRISP AS LETTUCE

Linen is washable but it can shrink if it has not been preshrunk by the manufacturer. As with all textile apparel, check the label before laundering.

To wash linens in a washing machine, use warm water and a short, gentle cycle. Dry garments on a clothing rack or hanger. If the linen is heavy, you can put the garment in the dryer for about 10 minutes to remove excess moisture.

When ironing, use a high temperature with a spray mist or

damp pressing cloth to press linen. As with stains on other fabrics, be careful not to rub the stain. Blot up any spill and have the garment drycleaned as soon as possible to avoid a permanent stain. Tell us exactly where the stain is and what caused it.
