Klipper Wilco sweeps series

THE MAKING OF CLUBS **FORGED**

The making of a forged club involves he forcing of heated steel into a master mold, in the case of Iron heads, a series of molds representing the full set of irons The molds are converted into pairs of steel forging dies, each representing a "negative" of half of a clubhead. The top die is attached to a forging hammer and dropped under pressure of up to 4 million lbs. onto the bottom die, with the metal heated to 2200 degrees F. sandwiched in between. What comes from the mold is a rough shaped iron head marked by a parting line where the upper and lower dies met at impact. The parting line is removed by a special trimming die and a series of wheels are used for basic grinding and deburring. A series of abrasive belts and wheels are used to remove scales and imperfections formed during forging and to grind and polish the head into its final shape. The hosel is bored out and the head ground to its proper weight. Roll dies then stamp the grooves, logos name and numbers onto the club head The head is then cleaned, chrome plated and the face sandblasted in the scoring area to provide a roughened surface.
