



# Sexual awareness symposium at GDHS

This past week, Georgetown District High School and General Brock High School combined to hold a Healthy Sexuality Symposium at GDHS. It was held so that teenagers could learn and ask questions about sex and sex related subjects including AIDS, birth control methods and pregnan-

The idea is not new. In fact, other symposiums have already been held in Scarborough high schools.

This Healthy Sexuality Symposium was organized by Heather Link. She is head of arts and information services at General Brock High School in Burlington. It serves as a pilot project for the Halton Hills community.

"If this is a successful project, we hope other schools will be encouraged and that they too will want to bring this 'portable' symposium to their schools," said Link.

Link hopes the symposium will help teenagers understand facts about sex and sexuality and that it will inform them on the positive and the negative aspects of sex. "I am concerned with the health curriculum in schools, it does not cut it. Teen pregnancy rate is high. Kids are sexually involved, so they need to be informed about the facts."

Shirleen Vela and Karen Gill from GDHS organized the event.

The symposium was not like a seminar or a lecture, it allowed students to walk around and interact.

The displays at the symposium were run by Halton Hills registered nurses. Each display provided teenagers with information. Not

only that, games were set up to test their knowledge on sexual issues. As an example, a roulette game that matched numbers with corresponding question cards regarding AIDS. A "speakers corner" was also set up so students could share comments regarding sex and about related pressures. Other displays also involved interaction by students and others simply provided information about abstinence, male and female, birth control methods, cost of methods, what to do when one is pregnant, and what to do in case of sexual assault.

This is not all fun and games, of course. It provided a comfortable, stress-free environment for students who otherwise might have felt restricted or embarrassed to ask important questions.

For students who still felt uneasy, pamphlets with contact phone numbers and information were also available.

On Wednesday, Rob Alexander, an HIV victim, attended the symposium to talk to students and answer questions.

Almost 450 students attended this event.

Although it was only a pilot project and only students in physical education classes attended, it is hoped that in years to come it will be offered to all students who wish to know more about healthy sex and sexuality.

Overall, the Healthy Sexuality Symposium was deemed a success by its organizers; more importantly, by the students who attended. As three Grade 10 students agreed; "We felt comfortable. It was education, and helped us to learn more, it taught us about sex. It was good!"
