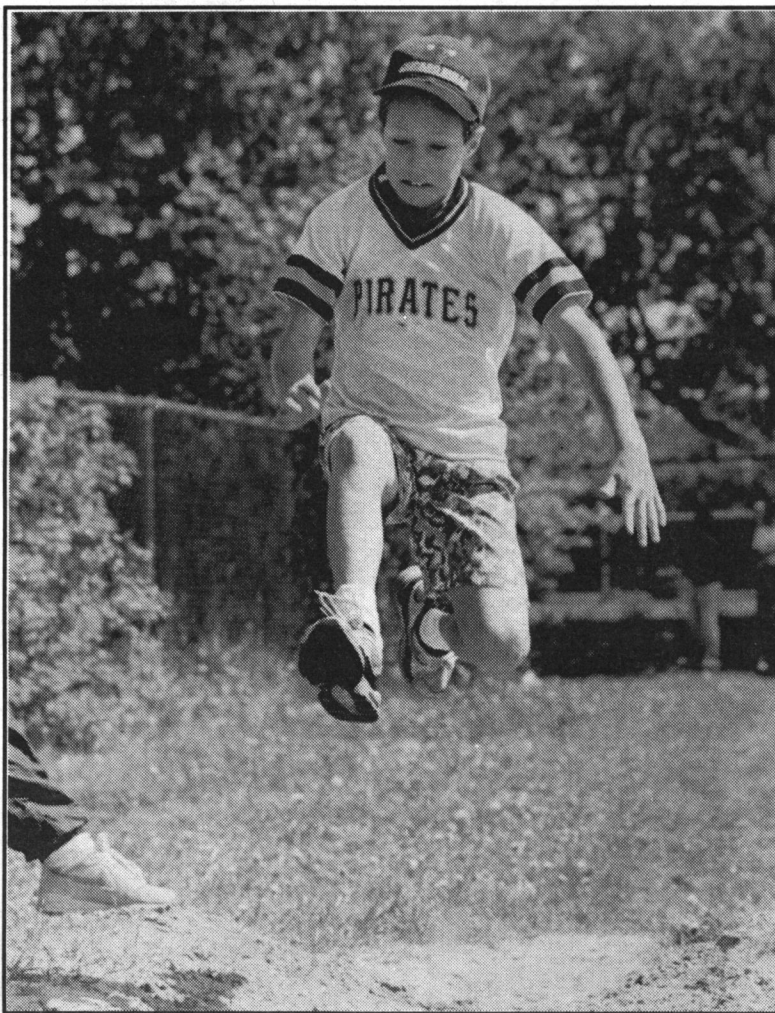

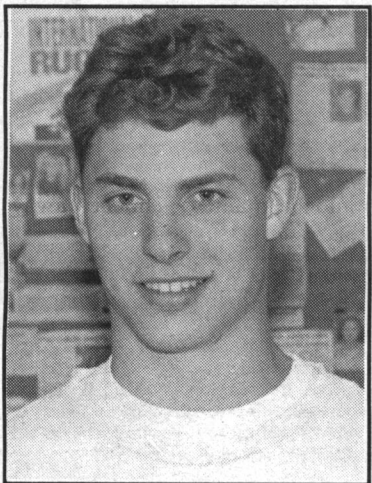
The girls ten-and-over had Jen Cabral win the standing long jump

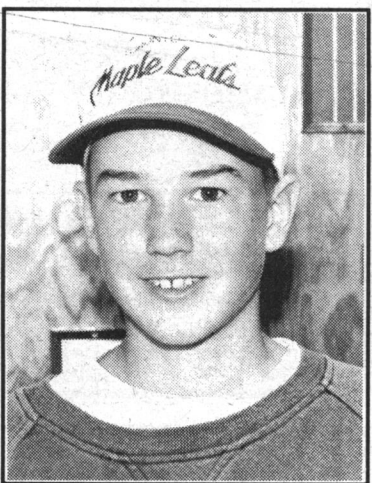
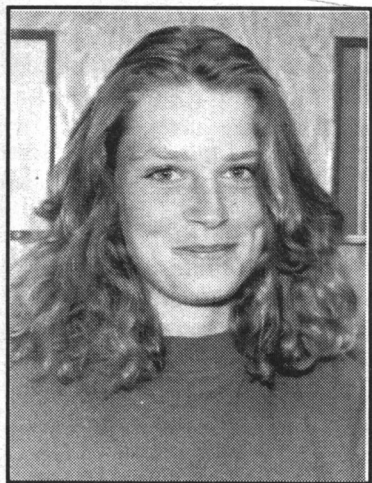

Young athletes from Halton Hills were among the over 200 competitors who took part in the 24th Annual Halton Catholic Track and Field Meet Tuesday at Nelson Stadium in Burlington.

Athletes from 30 elementary schools qualified for this regional meet by placing first or second at three qualifying meets in Burlington, Georgetown and Oakville.

From St. Joseph's in Acton, Joel Petkoff finished first in the Tyke long jump and third in the 100-metres, while Nicole LaForest took third in the Tyke girls high jump. In the Atom division, Stephanie Cameron was third in the girls high jump. The Bantam division saw Kris Vidic finish second in the boys 800-metres, Derek Lockerbie was third in the boys high jump and Julianna Soappin finished third in the girls shot put. Marie Ivory finished first in the girls shot put in the Midget division.

Holy Cross of Georgetown won three medals in the Atom division. The 4x100 girls B relay finished in

second place, Janelle Williams took third in the girls 60-metres and Adam Stoyles was third in the boys softball throw. Kim Moore was first in the Bantam girls high jump and third in the Bantam girls 200-metres, while Mariangela Gori took first place in the Bantam 60-metres. In the Midget division, Cheri-Anne Paisley finished first in the girls 100-metres; Angie Nelson was second in the girls 60-metres; the 4x100 girls A finished second and Sam Butt was third in the boys 200-

metres. For St. Francis of Assisi of Georgetown, Chris Kukkonen finished third in the Atom boys 400-metres; Clint Eggenberger was a second place finisher in the Bantam boys high jump; Christina Carter was third in the Midget girls long jump and the Midget boys 4x100 team placed third.

Sacre Coeur of Georgetown had Jamie McBride finish first in the Bantam boys 200-metres for its only placing.
