Reed ready to run

Cagey political veteran that he is, Halton-Peel federal Liberal candidate Julian Reed, tiptoed around Halton-Peel MP Garth Turner's performance at the federal PC leadership convention in Ottawa held over the weekend and also at Turner's overall performance during the PC leadership campaign.

"Let's put it this way," suggested a relaxed Reed. "He certainly has put our riding on the national map and only good can come of that."

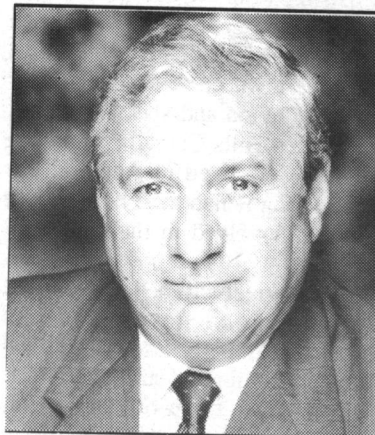
Reed, a longtime Norval resident who was elected as the Liberal Halton-Peel candidate to contest the expected federal fall election last September, is a former 10-year Liberal member of the provincial legislature who served in what is termed the opposition party's shadow cabinet.

"Mr. Turner probably gave as good a performance as any of the other leadership candidates Saturday night," said Reed, "and during the leadership debates, he handled himself well. He injected some much-needed levity into some of the debates."

Reed refused to comment any further on Turner's performance as a Member of Parliament or for that matter, on some of Turner's publicly-aired positions on issues, saying simply, "Until the election writs come down and I can debate with Mr. Turner face-to-face at all-candidates meetings, I don't feel it would be fair to take him on at this time."

Reed did say he and his party weren't particularly concerned who won the PC leadership race, because "We have the person we want as leader in Jean Chretien and Paul Martin has been hard at work mapping out our campaign strategy."

Reed said his office at home is

already overflowing with position papers on any number of matters and with an estimated 600 volunteers already tapped, he is anxious for an election call.

"I will campaign on issues," he insisted, "not personalities."

He does not appear to be too impressed with new Tory leader and Prime Minister-delegate Kim Campbell.

"She has a tendency to shoot off at the mouth and I think she will have to change her style over the next few months or else she and her party will be in serious trouble come election time. I wonder if she can handle the pressure of a federal election campaign," Reed mused.

Reed also had few kind words for departed Prime Minister, Brian Mulroney.

"He governed with a crisis mentality," insisted Reed. "The sad part about it is that he (Mulroney) created the crises himself."

"There were also more closures of debate under Mulroney than under any other federal government since Confederation."

Concerning the national debt, Reed chuckled and responded, "He (Mulroney) blames Trudeau. But the fact remains, Mulroney doubled our deficit in half the time it took Trudeau to create the deficit."
