## Acton burned again

Acton's water allocation dilemma has not yet been resolved, and councillor Rick Bonnette has had enough. "I'm not going to sit around and watch as Rome burns," he promised at Wednesday's Regional Planning and Public Works meeting.

Bonnette was irritated by the list of demands, presented by the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) to the Region, on which approval of the pumping of one million gallons of water in Acton rests.

Bonnette said he is planning to meet with Halton-Peel MP Garth Turner, Regional Planning and Public Works chair Marilyn Serjeantson, and Acton Councillor Norm Elliot, early next week to discuss the "totally unacceptable and one-sided" demands of the department. Bonnette is hoping Turner, will be able to influence the involved federal department. "Garth has an obligation to his constituents," he stated. "He's been helpful in the past and we hope he can help us solve this problem."

(Ed. note: since the House of Commons is now on summer vacation, this is probably a pie-in-thesky hope.)

Rash Mohammed, regional commissioner of planning and development, insisted he would welcome assistance from Bonnette, since he was becoming "reasonably offend-

ed" by the demands of the DFO Mohammed said the department wants the Region to develop a monitoring plan, which "is standard policy, except they (DFO) have not given us any details of this plan." Mohammed explained if the monitoring plan is too costly, developers may refuse to pay it.

The DFO also insisted the region establish a compensation agreement, but again no details were given. Regional councillors and department heads may be held personally accountable for any accident which could occur while pumping the one million gallons, but Mohammed admitted nothing was certain.

"This is such an unfortunate time for Acton, especially with the recent closing of the Hide House," Mohammed said. "There's a lot of pain in the community and it's very important to us that development be promoted to help the communi-

Ed Murphy, regional director of development review, said he was "waiting impatiently for the Department of Fisheries to respond to the full requirements," so the region can consider their acceptability.

If no agreement is reached, Bonnette predicts people will walk out of the OMB hearing, "and we'll waste another three years." Mohammed's predictions are more concise - "Acton will shut down."
