The loss to the number one Burlington squad was tough as the Eagles let a 7-2 lead slip away.

"We just didn't have the pitching after Grahame (Kennedy) and we were short of players," said manager Boyd Hoddinott.

With key players lost to injury and to exam finals, the pitching-short Eagles were ripe for the picking in other action as well as their regular season record fell to 5-2.

The Eagles split their two tournament games this past weekend dropping the opener 18-2 to host Clarkson before rebounding with a 16-0 thrashing of Woodbridge.

Don McLeod tossed a five inning no-hitter, facing the minimum 15

batters and throwing only 47 pitches. Doug Sheppard also launched a 350-foot grand slam in the win.

The tournament, which was rained out, will be concluded Saturday as the Eagles play in the consolation semi-final. Hoddinott hopes he will get some of his key players back this week.

"It's been tough," he said. "We've been trying to develop some pitchers lately other than the regular five and we've been roughed up. "It seems when we don't get good pitching the bats don't come around. The defense has played better and hopefully, we'll get some players back this week."

The Eagles played in Burlington Monday in the rubber match (at press time, the score wasn't available) and return to Georgetown for Thursday's game at the Fairgrounds, 7:30 p.m. against Cawthra.
