A topical animated children's tale

 Once Upon a Forest is an animated children's tale that combines a traditional fairy-tale setting with a modern and very politically correct

theme. The story revolves around three young students: a mouse, a hedgehog, and a mole (known as "furlings") and their schoolmaster, an aging badger.

While the furlings and schoolmaster are on a field trip, a truck carrying poisonous gas runs off the road and spills gas into their forest. When they return to their homes, they find environmental destruction and death. One of the students, a young female badger, is overcome by the gas when she tries to help her parents. In order to save her the schoolmaster needs certain herbs which were destroyed by the gas. The trio of young students therefore set off into uncharted lands to find the herbs needed to save their friend.

In their travels, the trio face numerous dangers, both natural and man-made. At one point they come across a flock of mourning birds. One of the young birds has been caught in mud and has been given up for dead. The pond the birds frequented had dried up after a construction crew began "developing" the nearby land. The birds refer to the bulldozers and backhoes as the "yellow dragons".

Following the successful rescue of the young bird, the flock of birds break into a tabernacle-style song of joy, led by a fire and brimstone singing minister. As time is running out on the trio, they reach a meadow that contains the needed herbs. But new trials and dangers await them as they strive to reach one of the herbs perched high up on a cliff.

What makes this movie politically correct? The leader of the trio of

furlings is a female mouse (Abigail) who is cast in a strong leadership role, ready to take initiative and make the tough decisions. Teamwork is also stressed among the three very different species that make up the trio. On their own, they are exposed and in danger, but through cooperation and group support, they are able to address and overcome challenges. The strongest message is the negative impact of humankind on the

environment and other species.

The characters and the concept for Once Upon a Forest have been created by Rae Lambert, who developed the story for the successful "An American Tale". The actual story is written by Mark Young and Kelly Ward and direction is by Charles Grosvenor. Michael Crawford provides the voice of the school teacher and the voice of the minister.

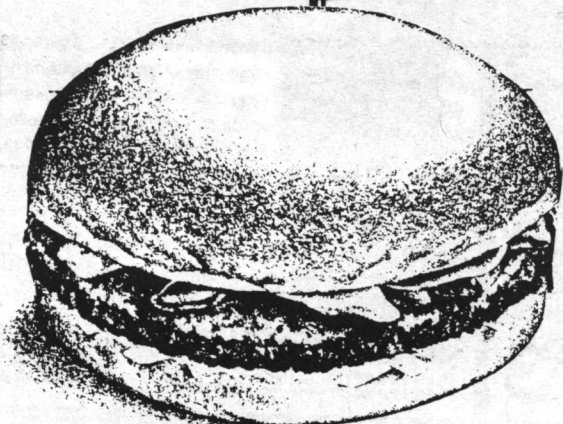
