## WEDGES

Wedges are very important clubs. Pitching wedges, sand wedges, dual wedges and the third wedges are designed to make certain shots easier. Most manufacturers build pitching wedges as an extension of one more club down from the 9 iron. The loft and hitting distance would be incremented and in progression with the rest of the set. The sand wedge can be a valuable asset to any player. In particular it can make most sand shots easier. The sand wedge is designed with a bounce type sole which keeps the clubhead from digging into the sand on the downswing. When used correctly the clubhead itself never touches the golf ball but rather the sand forces the ball out as it is squeezed by the clubhead. The sand wedge is more lofted than a pitching wedge, is usually the heaviest of all your irons and has the widest sole of any of your irons. The dual wedge is a cross between a pitching wedge and a sand wedge. Its purpose was to use one club for both pitching and sand shots. Once quite popular it is not used by many golfers today. A large number of present day golfers both amateur and professional carry a pitching wedge, a sand wedge and a third wedge. The third wedge because of its higher loft is used for a short distance shot from the fairway. It gets the ball quickly up and higher into the air with increased backspin. Depending on conditions it is also useful from bunkers and around the green.

And as the unknown golfer says:  
"To calculate the speed of a player's down swing multiply the speed of his backswing by his handicap. Eg. backswing 40 mph, handicap 15 - downswing 600 miles per hour."

Former Smoke Shop veteran Chris Sargent just might provide the much-needed guiding hand, as he has stepped in as coach.

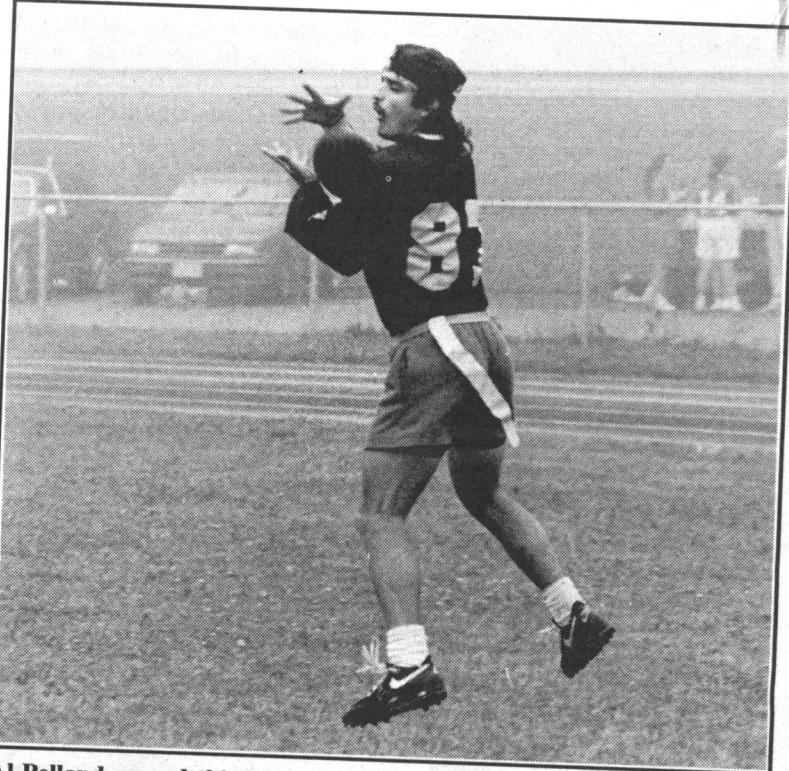
The teams played to a 14-14 half-time split, before the more experienced M&M team woke up and got serious and wrapped-up the win with a solid second half effort.
