







## Hillsburgh Panthers take crown from Ballinafad Jim Dandies

Acton Marauders claimed the Consolation Championship crown with a 4-3 triumph over the Bramalea Kinsmen Lakers.


Catch The Wave restored pride to the host league by advancing to the Consolation Championship semi-final before bowing to the eventual Consolation champion Marauders.




Bernice Griffiths (left) and Lynda Chadwick had no problem at all figuring out which team plays the next game - NOT.
