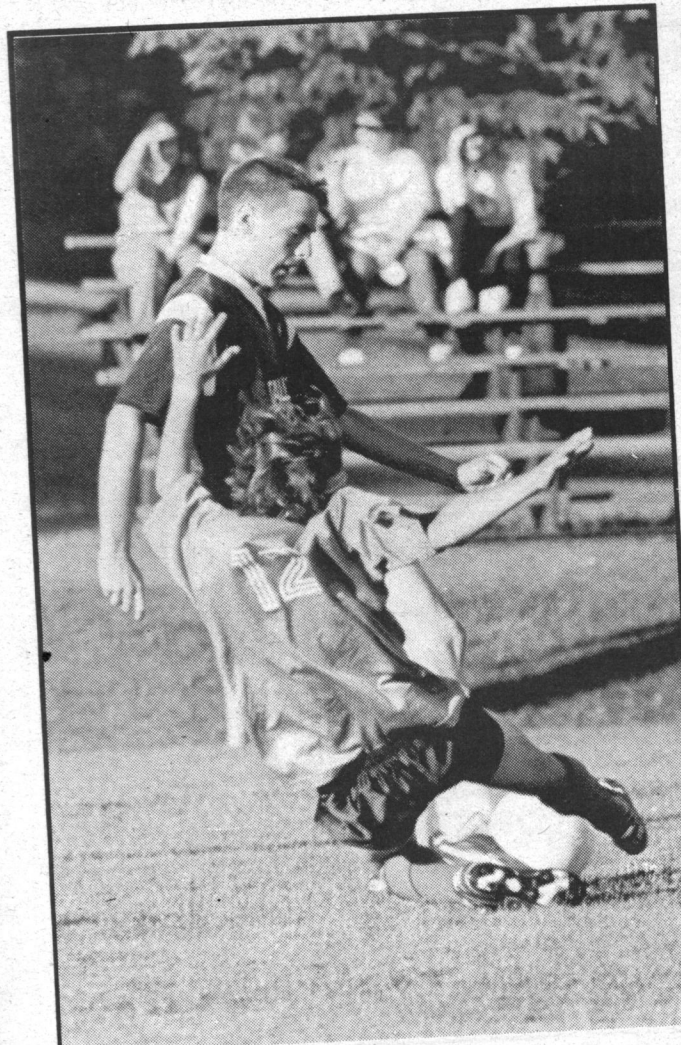
Countryside Orioles 17
