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Guilty as Sin - not

Guilty as Sin, written by Larry Cohen, will undoubtedly be remade one day into a movie that will be memorable and live up to a very promising script. The current edition, starring Don Johnson (of Miami Vice fame) and Rebecca DeMorney, falls short in its attempt to build a suspenseful plot and fully explore the contradictions in modern legal practice.

The story revolves around the rising legal career of Jennifer Haines (Rebecca DeMorney). Her success in getting Mafia figures off the hook captures the attention of a playboy, played by Johnson, who has been charged with the murder of his wife. At first, Haines rejects the case, but then talks herself into repre-

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sending him. Based on his word, Haines starts building a defense premised on Johnson's innocence. At this point in the movie, the viewer is invited to judge whether or not Johnson is innocent. Up to this point, we have no actual evidence to make a decision. We only have our impression of him.

Establishing opinions only on cursory impressions arises again and again, in Guilty As Sin, especially on the part of women. Johnson's charm and good looks continually win over women who are only too ready to help him. This places women in a negative light playing the part of emotional slaves, versus the rationality of men who draw deeper insights.

Director Sidney Lumet brings out an array of emotions in Johnson, but it is DeMorney who is the most convincing actor of the two. Both are overshadowed, however, by Jack Warden who plays the role of Moe, a friend of DeMorney's character, Jennifer Haines.

The biggest plus of Guilty As Sin is the photography, directed by Andrezej Bartkowiak. The scenes are rich in color, texture and filmed in a variety of lighting styles.

P.S. Viewers will note that Guilty As Sin is filmed in Toronto. Familiar landmarks include Old City Hall and Toronto harbor.
