

Inter-regional composting facility a possibility

The Halton regional council subcommittee on the composter will meet today (Wednesday) at the region's offices on Bronte Rd., to discuss the prospect of building an indoor compost facility which will service Halton and Peel Regions. Glenn Williams, manager of waste reduction and recovery for Peel Region has been invited to attend.

At this point, Miller Waste Systems is the only company which has responded to the regions' call for proposals to build the facility. Tom Hennessy, manager of business development for

the company, said Halton Region has until early August to assess the proposal.

Bruce Kitchen, regional director of design and construction, explained a detailed evaluation of the application still has to be done. "Although there is only one response to our call for proposals, we still have to do a pretty careful analysis to ensure the applicant is qualified," Kitchen said.

Kitchen would not release the projected cost for the facility, which is to be constructed by the landfill site on Hwy. 25, north of Oakville, because he is hop-

ing more applicants respond to the call for proposals.

Two companies have indicated interest in constructing private composting facilities in Halton Region - Equity Waste Management of Canada Corp., is deliberating on a site in Halton Hills, and Thermo Tech

Technologies Inc., in Burlington. Kitchen said the regional facility will still be built, regardless of the private facilities. "These facilities (private) will be dealing with industrial and commercial waste," he said, "and we will deal with residential."

Pizza Pizza take-out

Waste reduction grant

Noel Duignan, MPP Halton North, has announced a grant of \$49,433 to the Regional Municipality of Halton for a waste reduction project. The grant, announced on behalf of Environment and Energy Minister Bud Wildman, will assist the region with its review of the proposal for the development of a central composting facility.

"The project is a waste reduction initiative aimed at achieving — and surpassing

— Ontario's objective of reducing the waste going to landfill sites by at least 50 per cent by the year 2,000," Mr. Duignan said. "We are taking rapid strides to create a conservator society. The consumer society has outlived its wasteful days."

The grant is being provided through the ministry's Municipal 3Rs program, which assists municipalities in the prevention and recovery of materials entering the waste stream.
