



Composting...getting started

From Wastewise

Thousands of people across Ontario are discovering the benefits of composting: it helps the environment by reducing the amount of waste going to landfills and it's good for your garden.

About one third of household garbage is kitchen and yard waste. If you compost in addition to taking part in your local recycling program, it is estimated you can reduce the amount of garbage going to landfill sites by 50 per cent or more.

Composting turns kitchen and yard waste into dark, nutrient-rich soil conditioner, which can be used to improve the health of your lawn, garden and plants. Compost adds nutrients to the soil, and improves its texture and water-holding capacity.

If you're not composting, here's how to get started.

· Get a composting bin. Contact your municipal works department to ask if they have composting bins available at a reduced cost. You can also buy a commercial model from garden centres, or you can build one yourself. The ideal size to build is between one to oneand-a-half square metres (9 to 25 square feet).

· Add material. Start with a layer of plant stalks, twigs or other woody material. Add a layer of brown material (dry leaves, straw, sawdust or woodchips). Then add a layer of kitchen scraps or green plant material (like grass or plant clippings). You can add a little soil, too. It contains organisms which do the work of decomposition. Soil can also suppress

food odors. Continue alternating layers of yard waste, kitchen waste and soil. Brown yard waste is high in carbon while kitchen and green yard waste is high in nitrogen. Both carbon and nitrogen are needed to build a balanced compost pile.

Kitchen scraps that can be added to the compost bin are fruit and vegetable scraps, tea bags, egg shells, coffee grounds with filter paper and nut shells.

· Give it water and air. Keep it as moist as a squeezed-out sponge. Use a cover to keep it from becoming too wet from rainfall, and water it if it becomes dry. Provide air to the pile every two to three weeks by turning it with a pitchfork or shovel or aerating tool.

· Spread it around. It can take from two months to a year to get finished compost. Be patient. When compost is ready to use, it should be dark and crumbly with most of its original identity lost. Dig it into the earth before planting flowers and vegetables, or use it as a mulch around plants and trees to help retain moisture, smother weeds and prevent soil compaction. You can screen it and use it on your lawn or as part of a seed-starting mix, or mix it with equal parts water to make a nutritious "tea" for watering gardens, lawns and
