## Let's go to the circus!

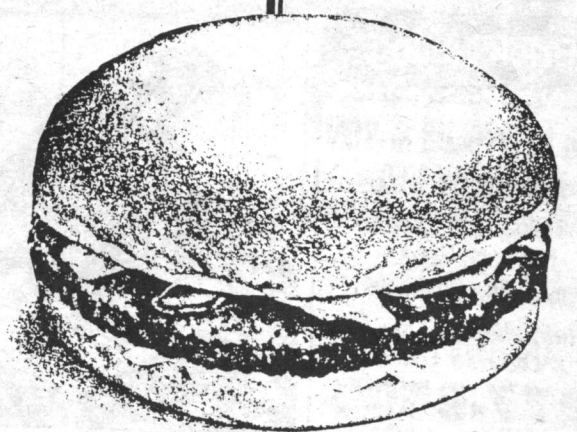
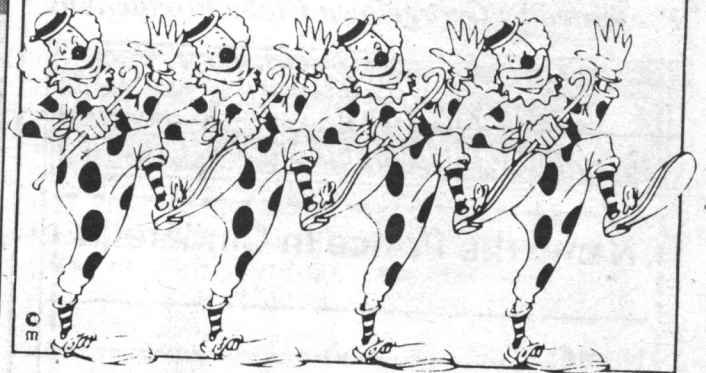
Going to the circus is a lot of fun. There are so many things going on at once. What's your favorite part of the circus? The interesting facts below may help you decide:
