## Car theft spree hits Halton Hills

In less than a week, car thieves struck the Halton Hills area four times. July 19, the abandoned car of a 69-year-old Georgetown woman was found in Brampton. The woman had given permission to an acquaintance to borrow her vehicle, with the understanding another friend was accompanying him in running a few errands. The acquaintance did not return, and the abandoned car was found several days later.

Last Wednesday, police found an abandoned, burned out 1991 white Acura on 10 Side Road, west of Trafalgar Rd. The owner of the car, an Oakville resident, had left the car at a Mississauga Nissan dealership to be sold on consignment. According to a

police report, the general manager of the dealership was perplexed about the theft of the insured car, which had a "state of the art" alarm sys-

## McLeod by-passes Halton Hills

A meeting held last Wednesday in Milton, to discuss concerns of the North-Halton riding with provincial Liberal leader Lyn McLeod, turned out to be a Milton-only meeting, but indications were given she would be coming to Halton Hills in the near future.

Walt Elliot, former Liberal MPP for the riding, explained Halton Hills and Milton share many concerns - water and sewage allocation, the necessity for a new infrastructure for economic growth, and the issue of roll backs beginning Aug. 1.

Milton business people, business-owners and town staff Elliott described as "very optimistic."

Another car, stolen June 17 from a Georgetown resident, was found in the Wasaga Beach area this past weekend, and a 19-year-old Brampton male was charged with possession of stolen property. According to a report, the 25year-old owner of the 1982 red Ford Escort was not willing to help police with their investigation, and it was only by coincidence the car was stopped by Wasaga Beach Ontario Provincial Police.

Thieves were more prosperous with the \$40,000 Cadillac taken from the driveway of a Georgetown residence early Sunday morning. Inside the car was a cellular telephone, camera equipment and between 12 -15 compact disks, valued altogether at \$3,500. Police have no suspects or witnesses, but are continuing their investigation.
