New group fighting for environmental concerns

The second meeting of the Halton Hills Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC) was held Wednesday evening at the Town of Halton Hills Civic Centre to finalize the first draft of the terms of refer-

ence for the newly-established committee.

The committee, which temporary chair and municipal councillor Gail Rutherford feels has been "set up too late," will be the local commenting agency on environmental issues.

Rutherford said that during the 1991 municipal elections, people expressed a great concern in the environment wanted it protected.

Rutherford added municipal environmental planner Arvin Prasad is occupied

with the Reclamation System Inc. issue, and in the meantime, an individual or group should be available to provide insight in to environmental issues.

Rutherford said the town does not have a social planner, adding the Halton Hills EAC will be able to address social issues because of the definition of "environment" which has been adopted. "We will not only concern ourselves with the natural environment, but also the socio-economic environment," Rutherford explained.

Halton Hills EAC is made up of councillors Al Cook, Kathy Gastle, Gerald Rennie, municipal deputy clerk Dorothy McDonald, and members of the public. "It's a marvelous group," Rutherford said enthusiastically. "We have many members of the public who are professionally involved with the environment and can really provide a lot of insight."

After the terms of reference are polished up at the Aug. 18 meeting, a final draft will be completed and presented at a Town of Halton Hills council meeting for approval. Municipal department heads will also be commenting on the draft. Rutherford hopes this process will be completed by the first week of September.
