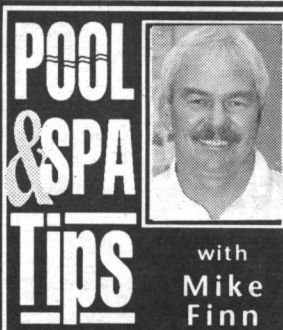
Defense B.J. Fleet darted in on a great play to help her goalie when the ball got behind her. Marissa Fread,

POOL & SPA TIPS

SPA AND POOL OWNERS ASK: "HOW DO CHLORINE AND BROMINE KILL BACTERIA IN MY POOL AND SPA?"

Whether you've enjoyed the benefits of a swimming pool or spa for several years or are a new convert, you undoubtedly know the necessity of keeping proper sanitizer levels in the water. Both chlorine and bromine are an important first step in keeping your investment a safe and healthy one.

But how do they do their job? Chlorine and bromine are similar in the way they kill bacteria and other organisms and there are advantages of each. Chlorine is generally more active than bromine at killing micro-organisms; bromine is not associated with the "chlorine smell".

Chlorine, in nearly every type, forms hypochlorous acid in water. This reaction depends on the pH level. When using chlorine, the ideal pH is between 7.4 and 7.6. If pH drops, more hypochlorous acid is formed.

Likewise, bromine forms hypobromous acid. But this reaction is not as pH dependent. In a brominated pool, more hypobromous acid is present at pH 8.0.
