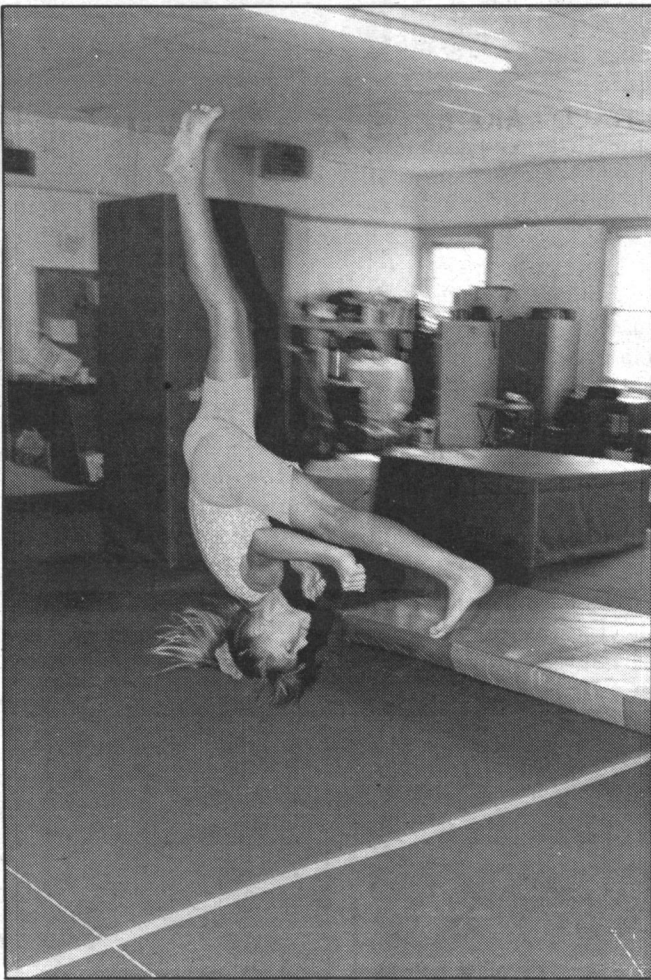


## Disguises - Pick out the users
