Day trips in Britain from London on the Venice Simplon-Orient-Express (VSOE) make an exciting addition to any itinerary planned for the well-heeled traveller.

The British section of the VSOE consists of original carriages built during the heyday of the railways in the 1920s and '30s. Everything in the cars has been faithfully restored, from the ornate brass accoutrements, to the engraved glass, mosaic floors and intricate marquetry.


