
These courses are all held at the Cedarvale Cottage at Main St. and Maple Avenue Georgetown. The classes are small so students get close attention from the

instructor. The courses are filled on a registration paid basis, first come-first served. Some of the courses fill quickly so prompt registration


advised...particularly for the children's courses. There is a minimum number of registrants required for a course to run with the deadline one week prior to the first class.

Town of Halton Hills director of planning, Ian Keith, agreed with Serjeantson. He attributed this change to the power of the DFO to fine and imprison anyone who harms the quality of water and fish habitat. "It's an intensely powerful piece of legislation," he admitted.

Regional councillors may have figured out a way to get around this legislation. Regional chairman Peter Pomeroy will be in contact with the Governor in Council, who has the authority to exempt Halton Region and its representatives from prosecution, under section 36(4) of

Serjeantson pointed out other possible dangers of the legislation. "Even if the DFO does not prosecute, anyone else can use this piece of legislature to prosecute.'
