## "Picture of Health" not for the squeamish

My love is music; my ambition is to promote what I love. This column will present information new and/or notable musicians both locally and on those, primarily Canadian, performing in the greater Toronto area, what might best be termed 'Alternative music.' So get your tuning forks out, read on and enjoy.

If you're not up to date on the darker side of reality, then pick up the latest offering from the Headstones, (an Ontario-based group), titled "Picture of Health". Not for the squeamish or those offended by a sticker that says "contains lyrics that may be offensive."

When I first attempted to

talk to the Headstones' singer Hugh Dillon, the first thing he suggested was "hey, \*!?!\* off!" I ignored his comment, after all, I had just asked, "how are you doing?" He quickly said his excitement had taken him over.

"Excitement about what," I asked. Hugh's reply was blunt and straight to the point. "None of your business."

Coherency in this interview was starting to seem elusive. Then he told me, "I'm excited

because I may have a part in a move."

Since that was clarified, the rest of the interview went on like a lush, green rolling meadow (or something like that)!

I asked him about the album name (originally to be titled "Black River") and he said, "'Picture of Health' came out of taking a good look in the mirror after running about for five days. If you were drunk, hangin' around, playin' gigs and talking to a lot of people

and you find yourself five days later.... Hence the title 'Picture of Health'."

The band includes Dillon (vocals, harp), Trent Carr (guitars, vocals), Mark Gibson (drums) and Tim White (bass, vocals).

Their music is like a late '60's or '70's hard rock style with a punk influence.

Better yet, imagine the Tragically Hip jamming with the Sex Pistols and you'll get an idea of what the Headstones are like.

I'd say probably something of a Hip influence due to the members being friends, some having gone to school together in Kingston.

Their music reveals street-wise realities as dark as the band's name and previous lifestyles. Nothing is held back on the album; drug addiction, nihilism and death are but a few realities spoken of, with song titles like "It's all Over", "Heart of Darkness", "Losing Control" and "Cemetery", you can imagine what scenarios are disclosed throughout this album (or CD or tape)!

Overall, I personally enjoy the album. It's honest, straight forward music that's not over-produced or muddled with technical jargon. It shows experimentation and expressiveness from a band with a lot of potential.
