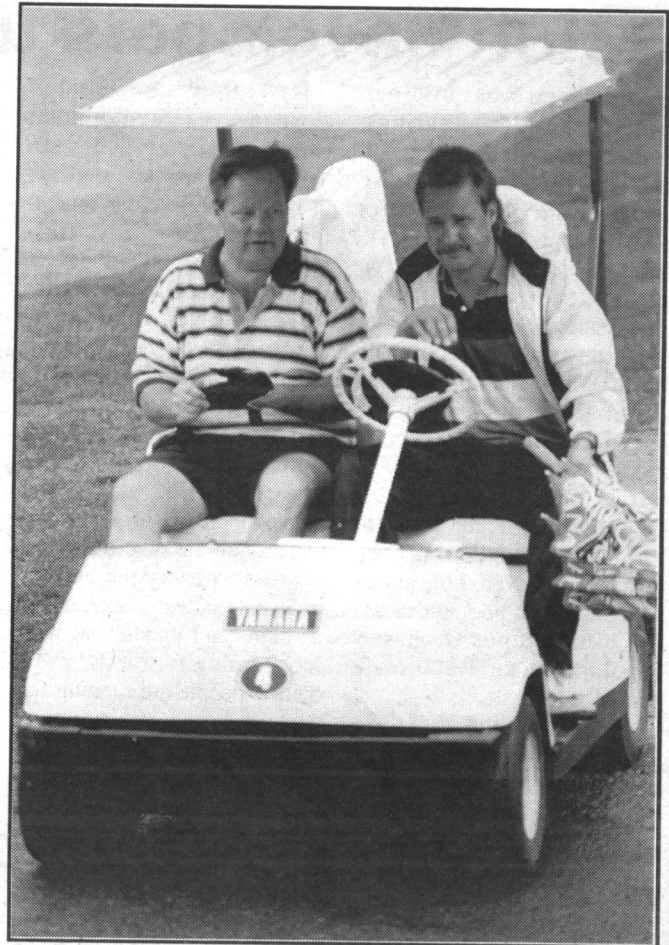

Some dirty pool

Police are looking for two youths who attacked a 17-year-old Brampton youth early Tuesday morning in the alleyway beside Fong's Restaurant on Mountainview Rd. in Georgetown.

The incident began when the two suspects exited Pro-Shooters Billiards on Guelph

St. at 1:30 am. and began arguing with the Brampton youth and his friends. The argument quickly turned into a physical confrontation, and when the two suspects fled, the Brampton youth chased them, believing they were pursuing one of his friends.

Once in the alley, the Brampton youth was cornered and hit repeatedly with an unknown object, according to police. He was taken to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital with abdominal pains but later released.

The first suspect is described as white, with blond, shoulder-length hair, a day's growth of hair on his face, wearing a Tazmanian devil T-shirt and shorts.

The second suspect is also white, with brown shoulder-length hair, wearing rolled up dark track pants and no shoes.

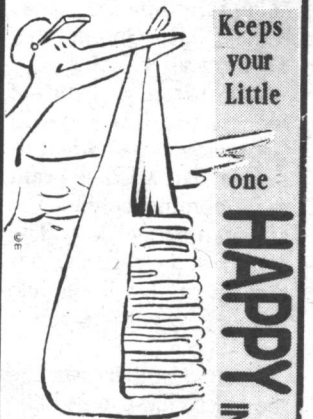
The Grand Canyon Railway steam train makes the 2 1/2 hour journey from Williams, Arizona to the South Rim of the Grand Canyon. The trip covers 65 miles of classic Old West territory, past pine forests, scenic arroyos and wide-open plains. Passengers travel in restored 1920's Harriman coach cars and the trip includes a 4 hour stop at Grand Canyon, allowing passengers to hike the trails or take a bus or air excursion.

Passengers who simply want to tour the area are always fascinated by the railway's Grand Canyon Depot, the last log constructed depot serving an active railroad in the U.S. Listed in the National Register of Historic Places as a National Landmark, the building was completed in 1910.

Service on the Grand Canyon Railway began in September 1989, it became very popular and now carries more than 90,000 passengers annually. On the environmental side, the train has been credited with reducing automobile traffic to the Grand Canyon's South Rim by approximately 33,000 vehicles per year.
