tryside will be staged with the highlight of the ride being a stop-off at the internationally recognized Canadian Military Studies Museum in Limehouse.


The CMSM offers a host of historic artifacts of modern military history spanning several wars up to present times. Included in the exhibits are several rather unique examples of military motorcycles.
