

Confused about **Thermometers**

"I know that there are different types of thermometers. What do I need for home

You will need at least one or more fever thermometers for home use.

The old reliable way to measure a fever is with a mercury thermometer. Mercury thermometers are popular because they are self registering. Once the mercury column in such a thermometer reaches a maximum temperature height, it stays there until shaken down. Mercury thermometers are calibrated in both Fahrenheit and Celcius scales.

Most Pharmacists carry 3 kinds of mercury thermometers: oral, to be placed under the tongue for 5 to 10 minutes; rectal, to be inserted into the rectum for at least 3 minutes, and security.

A security thermometer can be bought for either rectal or for oral use. It may not be used for both.

Each method produces a slightly different reading. Your "normal" oral temperature will usually be within a degree of 37°C (98.6°F). Your normal rectal temperature will be 37.5°C (99.5°F).

You also have an axillary temperature. Although it is not a precise as an oral or rectal temperature, it is handy to know. Just tuck any mercury thermometer into your armpit and hold your arm tightly against your body for 3 to 5 minutes. It should be within a degree of 36.5°C

You have a fever if you have an oral temperature greater than 37°C (98.6°F), axillary temperature greater than 36.5°C (98.6°F), axillary temperature greater than 36.5°C (97.7°F). Before using any mercury thermometer you have to shake it down. This isn't easy. Ask your pharmacist to show you have show you how.

Digital thermometers are relatively new to the market. Less time is needed to get an accurate temperature reading than with mercury thermometers. They are not easily broken, and the temperature reading shows up on a small screen, so these thermometers are very easy to read. They are battery powered, however, so you must make sure to have fresh batteries on hand.

Another way to measure fever is with thermometer strips. They indicate temperature by changing color. Although easy to use and certainly safe, thermometer strips are not very

You may also have heard of basal thermometers. They are used to help determine ovulation time in women. They cannot be used as fever thermometers because they are not calibrated to read high temperatures.

Always be sure when you have finished using a thermometer that you wash it with soap, wipe it with alcohol, and store it carefully away - where you can find it the next time you want to use

Do not take an oral temperature for at least 30 minutes if patient has had anything hot or cold to drink or has been smoking. The reading will not be

Do not take a rectal temperature without greasing the thermometer with cause pain.

Every home needs at least one thermometer just for measuring oral temperatures. If you have young children or babies, you need a thermometer for rectal temperatures also. You can use a rectal or oral thermometer to take an axillary temperature, too.
