## Halton Cable Systems will continue to offer Vision TV

Monday, John De Jong, General Manager of Halton Cable Systems said the company will continue offering Vision TV, for the time being.

The company had intended to drop Visions on September

1st because the network changed their method of transmission to a mode which is incompatible with present equipment, and refused to supply the required new electron-

"However," said De Jong,

sion to take Vision off the air prompted six or seven letters and about a dozen phone calls from complainants. "Not very many at all, considering we have over 16,000 subscribers," said De Jong. "Some of the letters are so similar that you'd think someone had organized a campaign."

In a survey taken in 1989, subscribers overwhelmingly declared they did not want to receive channels for which they had no option. According to regulations, if some of the Canadian specialty channels are carried, all cable customers must pay for them whether they choose them or not.

Vision TV placed very low in the ratings at that time, but Halton Cable eventually purchased the necessary processing equipment and placed the network on channel 33 under the understanding there would be no cost to subscribers. Vision has since applied to the CRTC for permission to charge all cable customers a pass-through fee.

"It's important to remember," added De Jong, "that when we added Vision, we did not increase our subscription rates. Nor, by the way, are we increasing basic service rates next year, even though our costs have gone up. This will be the third year in a row. We realize it's important to try to keep the rates as low as we can, and we think our customers appreciate that we keep them in mind."
