Dave Kotsos eyes golf tour title

Four Halton Hills golfers placed in the top 10 in the Accuform Junior Tour held at North Halton Golf and Country Club Friday. This included a third place performance by Duane Erler.

Erler finished with a final round 76, six strokes behind winner Shawn Beatty of Burlington, who had a two-under-par 70 thanks to five birdies and three bogies.

Michael Evans and Darin Finlayson tied for fifth with scores of 78, but the big story is 16-year-old Dave Kotsos of Georgetown who also placed fifth and is now second in the overall standings going into the final stop on the Accuform Tour.


Kotsos, who is a rookie on the Tour will challenge last year's defending champ Mitch Mahoney from Hamiltonfor the championship.

"I feel like I can keep up with these guys and put in a good round every day. "It has turned out a little better than I expected, "Kotsos was quoted as saying.

Many of the top junior golfers from the Halton and Hamilton-Wentworth regions play on the Accuform Tour because it helps them in their quest for scholarships in the U.S. and tour scores and placings help considerably.

Kotsos has 309.5 points, 18 back of Mahoney while his brother Mike is in third place with 299 points. Ian Windsor, who plays out of Georgetown Golf and Country Club, is sixth overall with 276.5 points and Erler is seventh with 268.5 points.

The final stop on the Accuform tour was Monday in Ancaster. Results were not available at press time.
