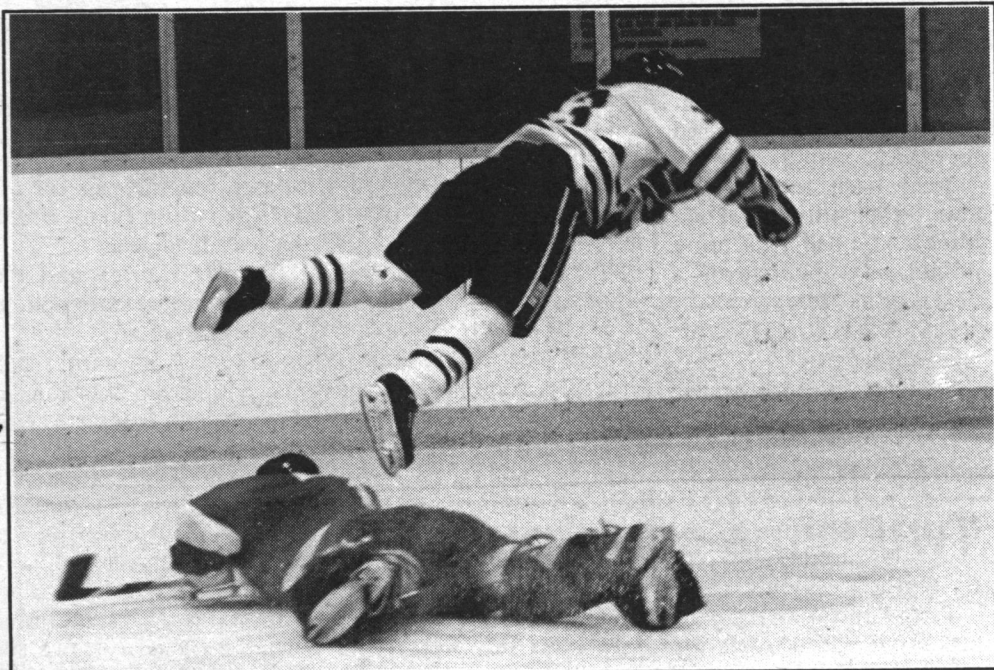

Raiders split pair with Markham

It was a jekyll and hyde weekend for the Georgetown Chrysler Raiders in two exhibition Ontario Provincial Junior A clashes against the Markham Waxers.

The Raiders waltzed into Markham Friday night and came away 8-5 winners, but on Saturday night at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, the Waxers cruised to a 12-4 triumph.

Everything went the Raiders way Friday night and along with the usual one-two punch of Trevor Brandt and Ian Ellis, who combined for five points, other players appear ready to share the scoring load.

Will North, who has signed with the Raiders after playing last year with North York Canadians, has been a welcome addition. North netted five points on the weekend, four coming on the power play while combining with Brandt and Ellis.

Also having big games Friday were Will Mansour, with a goal and two assists; Mike Bajurny, who contributed two goals and David Osbourne who notched two assists.

Stephan Mifflen and David Kennedy shared the goaltending duties Friday night, both playing well.

Saturday night was a differ-

ent story.

Markham popped in eight goals in Saturday's second stanza, exposing the inexperience of the Raiders defense and simply outthusted the hometown favorites.

Markham scored 40 seconds into the game before the Raiders tied it on the power play, as North scored on a scramble in front of the net. The Raiders then enjoyed their only lead on the night thanks to another power play marker. This one by Ellis, knocking in a rebound with Brandt and North assisting.

Markham tied it on a goal mouth scramble.

Markham had their way in front of the Raider net all night, outmuscling Georgetown defenders and literally leaving goalies Paul Stinnett and Kennedy to fend for themselves.

"We haven't had a chance to set the defense yet and they still have to learn the system but it will come," said Raiders' assistant coach Jay Anderson. "Even the veterans were scrambling around tonight, something you can't do against a team like Markham."

Six minor penalties hurt the Raiders in that second period as they played shorthanded most of the time. The outcome could have been worse but

Stinnett and Kennedy made some nice saves.

Kennedy, who came in with the score 5-2, got shelled for five in the second but played a very strong third period and kept the damage at 12.

The Raiders next exhibition game is Thursday (tomorrow), 7:30 p.m. at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena against the Guelph Platers. Friday night, Raiders journey to Guelph to test the Platers on their home ice.

Raiders open regular season play Sept. 25, 7:30 p.m. at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena, against the Brampton Capitals.

Basketball fever grips Halton Hills

After many years of limited participation, why has interest in basketball in Georgetown skyrocketed? Participant Wally Carter said, "The present format of offering two divisions, one for the more advanced player and one for the recreational player suits my style perfectly. Fun, recreation,

goodwill and sportsmanship are the characteristics that describe league play."

Most of the participants feel that there is sufficient pressure and competition in their professional and work lives and they see this form of recreation as an opportunity to maintain and improve basketball skills and physical fitness, to have fun and to meet other players. The level of play improved considerably throughout the season as some "old skills" were rediscovered.

In addition to weekly games, the league also offers interested members the opportunity to play in tournaments (such as the Annual Halton Region Invitational in Milton and the Streetball 3-on-3 Tournament at the Skydome).

Camp begins this Tuesday, with league play starting Oct. 5 and running until the end of May. Registration fees are \$35 payable to HHMBL with a completed application form and includes a team shirt.

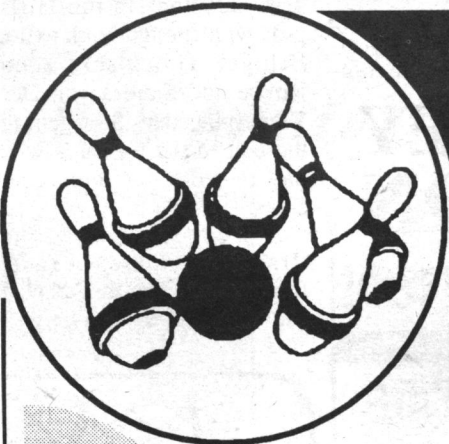
Mini-Soccer Finals Day
