## Pro Shooters chalks one up for closing time

Pro Shooters Billiards and Cafe, located on the corner of Mountainview Rd. and Guelph St. in Georgetown, will finally benefit from one consistent closing time.

Currently, the establishment is subject to an 11 p.m. closing for the billiard tables, 12 midnight for video games and 1 a.m. for liquor service. Primo Pierozzi, appearing on behalf of the owners, appealed to Town of Halton Hills councillors at Tuesday's general committee meeting to extend the 11 p.m. closure to 1 a.m. "We can't give any satisfaction to our clients (with an 11 p.m. closing time)," insisted Pierozzi.

He said when the property was purchased in February, one of the owners, Joe

Dinoto, was not notified of the 11 p.m. closure. When the building permit was approved, no one mentioned the required closing time. On July 27, when the liquor license was applied for - again, no reference to the closing time.

"We have signed an 18-year lease," Pierozzi complained, "and at no time were we told about the closing time."

Pierozzi listed the times billiard halls in other municipalities are required to shut down. A 1 a.m. closing time is enforced in Milton, Brampton and Mississauga. Billiard players in Toronto, Scarborough and Bolton can enjoy the game 24-hours a day. He pointed out, that according to the Ontario Municipal Board, closing times of billiard establish-

ments are under the jurisdiction of individual municipalities.

Coun. Anne Currie praised the billiard hall. "It's the cleanest, most brightly-lit pool hall I've ever seen," she said. "Not that I habituate pool halls," she quickly added. Currie pointed out the by-law (regarding closing times) is outdated and should be altered.

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Mayor Russ Miller agreed, adding all three closing times should be consistent - 1 a.m.

Councillors agreed to refer the item to town staff for evaluation, after which, it will be brought back to council for voting.

busy streets, and each development should contain at least one day care facility for younger children.

Johnson insisted growth rates must be strictly monitored, and development should be phased. She suggested council restrict developments to the lower end of allowable densities, and applied this same theory to building heights.

"If the developers complain about not making enough money - so be it," she maintained. "You (councillors) are responsible for a lot more than the developer's profit."

Johnson's final suggestion concerned the Dominion Seed Property which was designated July 29 special mixed-use node. This designation includes residential, retail commercial, office, community, transit, parks and open space uses. Johnson urged council to

demand a park which "will be the envy of all other communities."

Johnston followed with her own recommendations. She suggested the Halton Board of Education reevaluate a previously selected school site in consideration of the population increase in the segment of the Ward 3 area. She suggested council plan an appropriate road network to meet future safety needs, and purchase parkland for the residents.

"We all know social problems come around when kids have no where to go or play," Johnston said.

She insisted on integrated and comprehensive development of the area, and the development of controls, triggered by population increases, to be control traffic and other potential growth-related problems.


Council accepted the report, which will be voted on this Monday.

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


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
