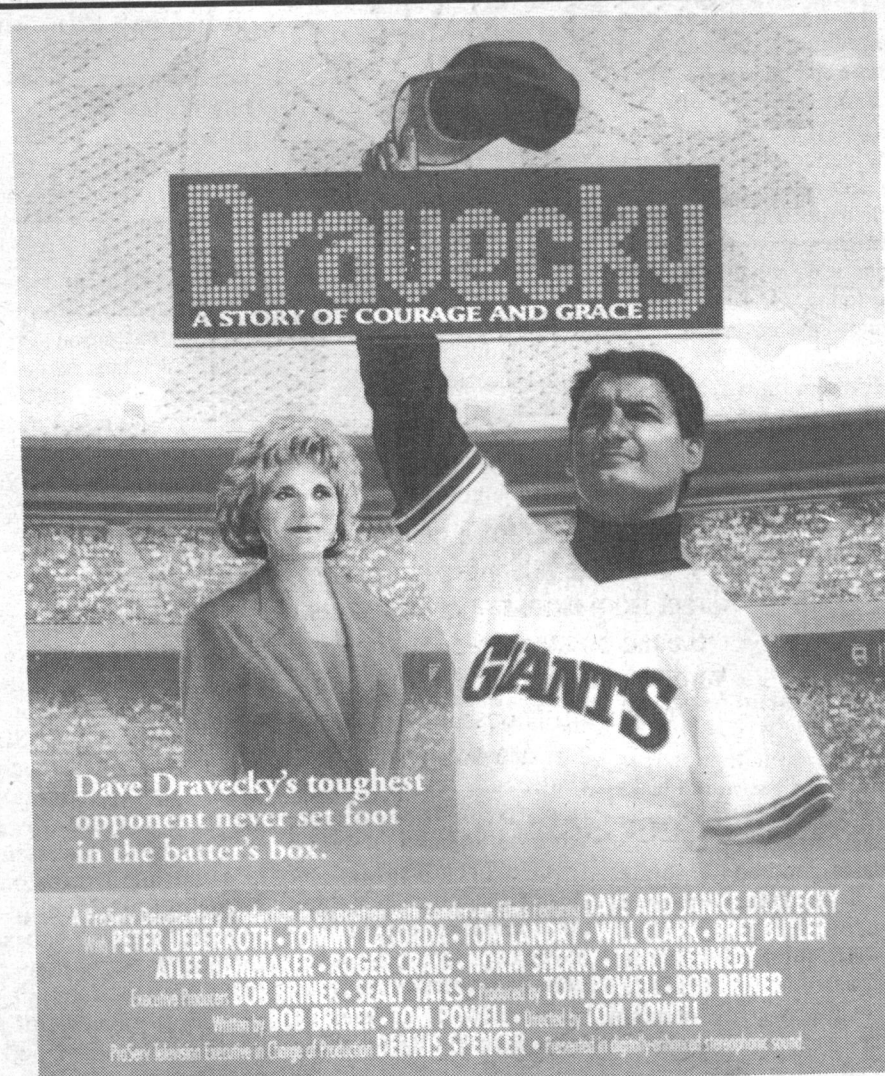
Obstetrics Ward. These examples of the many recent improvements made at the Hospital will be on display for the public.

Fabric Care TIPS

It's Sweater Weather

This season's sweaters include autumn mainstays in traditional wool and classic cotton. But there is so much more to know! Retailers are offering sweaters made of silk blends. There is also a renewed interest in natural fibres such as angora, mohair, cashmere, and shetland. Decorative trims such as leather, suede, snakeskin, fur, sequins, and beads add a special look to many knitted items.

These sometimes delicate knits - especially those with decorative trim - require special attention.

Proper Care
 If the care label recommends at-home washing, read and follow the instructions carefully. When the care label reads "dryclean only", take your sweater to Barragers Cleaners. Point out any spots or stains which may require special treatment.

Some trims can be difficult to clean. When you purchase a garment with trim, ask about the retailer's return policy. If there's any doubt about care procedures, ask the staff at Barragers to pre-test a small area to determine how it will clean. If a problem occurs in the care process, the garment should be returned to the retailer for a refund.
