

Longhorns win regular season title

Regular season play in the Georgetown Mens Flag Football League concluded last Sunday at GDHS, with the loop's front running duo of Longhorns and the Dawgs winning handily and M&M Pro Sports locking up third place.

The Dawgs mauled Plus Welding 43-12, Longhorns downed Meznic Electric 31-13 and M&M blanked a game, but outgunned, Muscle Pit squad 26-0.

Longhorns end up in first, with the Dawgs in second. Both teams get a bye through the first round of the playoffs. M&M's win means they get to meet the same Muscle Pit group Sunday (tomorrow) 10 a.m. in a playoff match.

The second playoff tussle, at 11 a.m. sees Meznic (fourth-place finishers) meeting fifth place Plus Welding.

Al Pelland of the Dawgs won the league's scoring title with 118 points. It had been thought this would be a league record, but according to members of the league's executive, the actual record is in the 130-point range. Regardless, a fine offensive year for the speedy Dawgs receiver.

Greg Lawr of Plus Welding won the interception title with six. Mike Delguidice and Dave Clements of the Dawgs tied for second place along with Paul Martin of Plus Welding and Bob Davey of the Longhorns - each player had four.

Marcus Noel of Plus Welding had three interceptions, as did Mark McKeon of M&M. Thirteen players each had two.

John Proudfoot had the other M&M touchdown, while McKeon also contributed a single on a punt.

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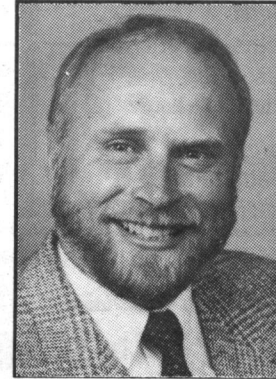
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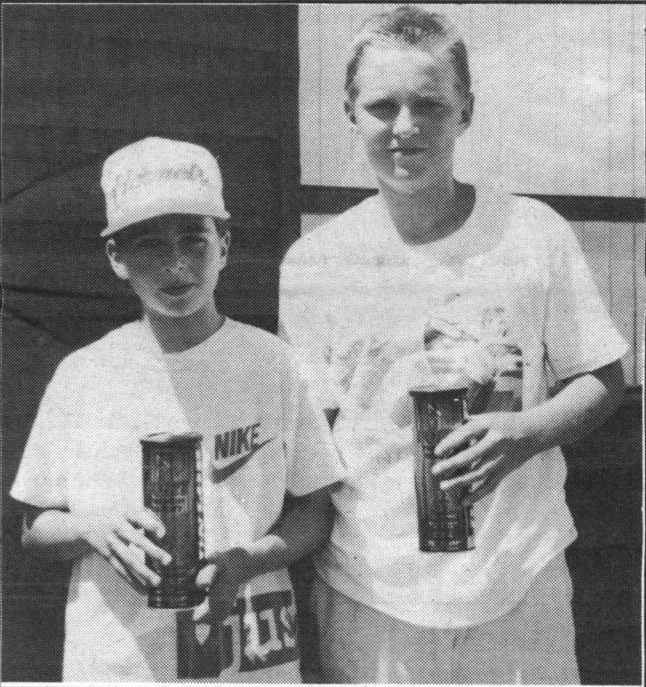
