Turner meets local pols

Acton development was scrutinized once again, this time by Halton Regional Councillors and Halton-Peel M.P. Garth Turner.

A meeting was held Tuesday morning at Turner's Guelph St. constituency office, to "talk about the concerns of Acton and establish a good working relationship," explained local and regional councillor Marilyn Serjeantson.

In attendance were local and regional councillors Bill Robson and Rick Bonnette, Acton councillor Norm Elliott, regional chair Peter Pomeroy, regional chief administrative officer John Burke and Town administrator Ray King.

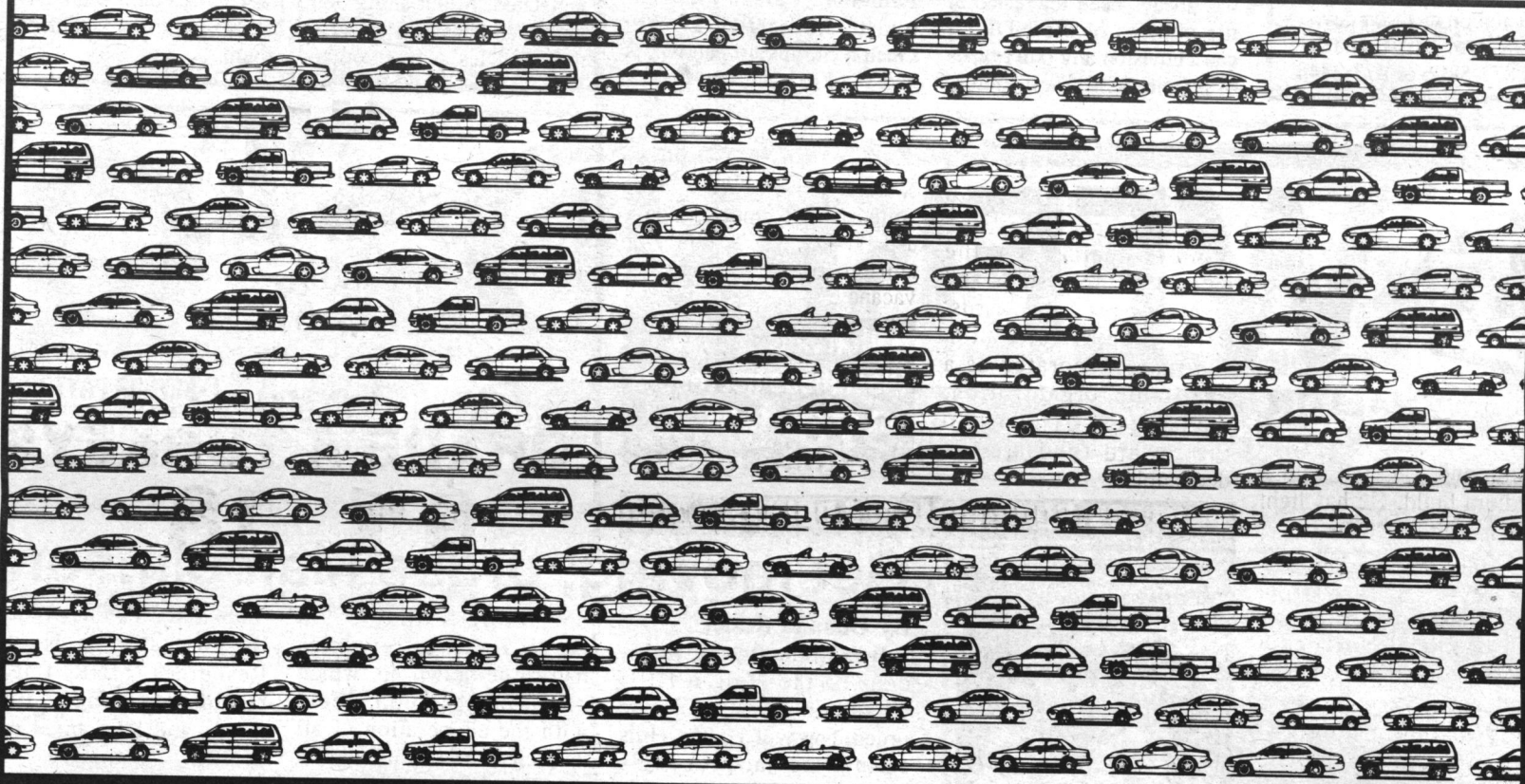
Serjeantson added what everyone was trying to work out was how to accomplish both a fish habitat study and waste water treatment plant audit as cost-effectively and speedily as possible. "We all want to get the best thing for our buck," Serjeantson said.

Asked if any regional councillors responded to Turner's Sept. 13 allegation that regional councillors are using the Fisheries Act as an excuse, Serjeantson responded, "that wasn't what the meeting was about. It's all water under the bridge now."

(Under the Act, individuals can be held personally liable for the increase of deleterious substances in Black Creek or Fairy Lake.)

"I think the meeting went very well," insisted Serjeantson. "We laid the groundwork to get things done."
