Classes run 9 a.m .-2 p.m. plus one hour of counseling time. Participants will examine the economic and business cycle, deal with



stress and time management, learn communication tools, job marketing skills and assess personal skills.

In Georgetown, jobsOntario is offering a Career Planning course from Oct. 18 - Dec. 24. This course will assist the unemployed in identifying realistic career goals and develop an action plan to attain these goals. Participants will assess and validate personal skills, learn effective time management, examine

values, skills and labor market trends. Participants will also deal with accepting change, overcoming fears, decisionmaking, resume writing, examining the job market and developing job search skills.

These courses are offered to those who qualify for iobsOntario training. To qualify, you must be receiving social assistance, FBA, be a U.I. exhaustee (your UIC claim has run out), be ineligible for U.I. or receiving workman's compensation.
