Resident claims landfill affecting water

 Nelson Lawrence has told Halton regional councillors that he and his family are sick and believe their well water is being contaminated by the region's landfill site. Lawrence, whose Milton property is adjacent to the site on Hwy. 25, just north of Oakville, wants access to regional documents which he thinks will help to prove his point. But he says he can't afford

to pay the fees, set under the provincial freedom of information program, to get copies of the documents. It would cost about \$1,000 in preparation work and photocopying to get copies of one set of documents. Lawrence says there are five sets he needs. "As a single parent, I can't afford to pay this," Lawrence says. He says his business is suffering because he has spent so much time working on his water problems.

Council's administration and finance committee refused Lawrence's application to have the fees waived. However, committee members offered to let him see the documents at regional headquarters so that he can make a detailed list of what he needs. They suggested they might consider waiving the fees if Lawrence comes up with a more accurate and reduced estimate of what fees will have to be paid.

Last chance for Barber Mill input

 Members of the public will have their last chance to influence the fate of the historic Barber Mill Dam Wednesday evening, at the Cultural Centre/Library Complex, 9 Church St. in Georgetown. At the 7 p.m. meeting, the Barber Mill Dam ESR: Public Advisory Committee will present a compiled report, listing conclusions gathered from public input. Public opinion was accumulated during an April Open House and through mailed out questionnaires. According to Joan Harris, chair of the committee, the most frequent response to the questionnaire and at the Open House was that the entire mill site, located on River Dr. in Georgetown, including the dam, would be

developed. A public park seemed to be the most popular option for the site. Regarding the dam itself, Harris stated public comments indicated local residents want the dam to be refurbished with materials consistent with the period in

which the dam was built despite an increase in cost. Representatives of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority (CVCA) and of Totten, Sims, Hubicki Associates, consultants for CVCA, will be making presentations.

Flu vaccine now available

The influenza vaccine for the 1993-1994 influenza season has arrived. This year's vaccine will prevent or lessen the seriousness of influenza caused by Beijing, Texas and Panama strains of the influenza virus. Flu vaccine is provided free of charge to people over 65 years of age. It is also free to people of any age with serious heart, lung or kidney disease, diabetes or cancer. People who are not eligible to receive vaccine at no charge can purchase the vaccine from local pharmacies under a doctor's prescription. Individuals wanting to receive the influenza vaccine should contact their doctor. For information, contact the Halton Regional Health Department at 825-6060 and ask for the Communicable Diseases Program.
