She will be at Oxbow Books on Georgetown's Downtown Main Street this Saturday at 2 p.m. to autograph her books for her fans and also to chat about her writing.

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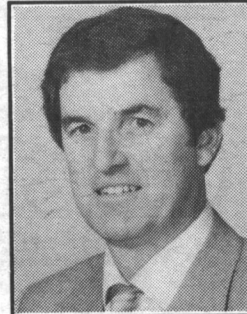
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## Out at the Ranch
