Bingo believers may find Nirvana in Norval

If Town of Halton Hills staff reports favorably on the proposition of reopening a bingo hall in Norval, and municipal councillors the report, accept Burlington resident Ray Smith will be one step closer in overriding a provincial moratorium on the opening of new bingo parlors.

Smith has proposed opening a bingo hall at the old Country Dreams Club, formerly the Riviera Club, on Guelph St. in Norval. A 1988 provincial moratorium prohibits the opening of new bingo halls, but Smith said his is a "unique situation" because he is asking council to approve a bingo facility which has already been licensed as such.

Smith informed councillors the parlor would be available to charities, service clubs and other nonprofit organizations. He added he would invest \$200,000 to improve the establishment, mentioning specifically the installation of smoke-removal devices.

He added the previous bingo facility closed because of low attendance and high expenses, but was confident he could conquer such problems.

Councillor Kathy Gastle, a Norval resident, did not approve of the proposal. "I don't feel this municipality should override a moratorium," she said. "It would set a precedent."

Council nevertheless decided to direct staff to make a report - the time frame not being set.






