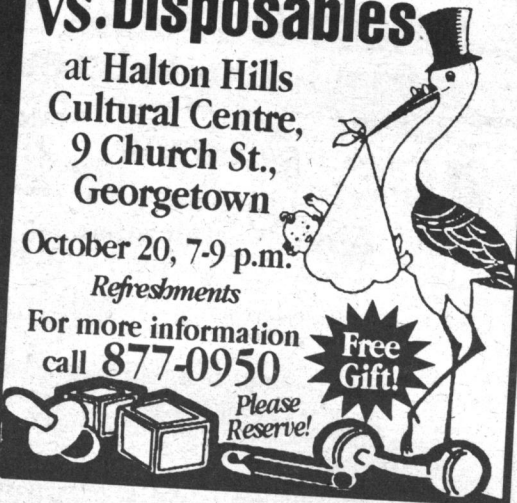

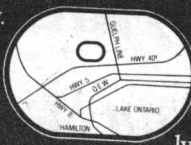
By the way, rumor has it that the cribbage and darts gang have started their regular games. If you have not joined up and want to, you had better get down to the Branch and get involved.
