Along with the "fowl" activities, there were the traditional staples of the fair, including midway, live musical performances, track pulls, livestock shows, and the crowning of Miss Acton Fall Fair.

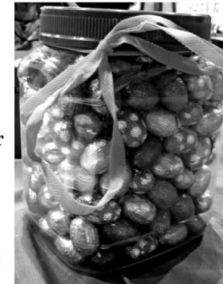
