"Thank you to everyone, because without the community pitching in, a building is just the stone, the drywall and everything else, but having the Rotary here, brings life to this place and all the other events... This [cheque] was really something that kept us going when we thought we'd come to the end of how we were ever going to meet that final amount. It's almost as if someone had said 'this is what we can do for you and we want it to work.' So, thank you to Rotary for that."

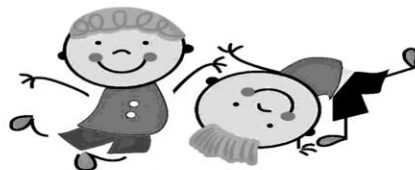
