

## Health care crucial says Peterson

note:Norma Peterson, NDP federal election candidate for Halton-Peel had this to say about health care:

"Ten years ago, it would have been unthinkable to talk about the destruction of Canada's health care system. Medicare is a source of pride to Canadians and people today are worried about the move toward a two-tiered health care system. But the current health care crisis grew directly out of policies introduced by Liberal and Tory governments'

'Where was Jean Chretien when the Liberal government placed a ceiling on federal health care contributions in 1975, and again in 1977 when they ended 50/50 financing, and yet again in 1982 when

the Liberals ended a program that would have provided \$4 billion in health and post-secondary education funding?"

Jean Chretien was at the cabinet table every time a Liberal government cut back it's support for Canada's health care system.

The Liberals claim they will protect Medicare. In 1988 they said that free trade was the fight of their lives, and they've given up that fight. It's a question of trust. If they abandoned their opposition to free trade so easily, can we risk letting the Liberals give up on medicare too.

"The New Democrats brought medicare to Canada. We fought for it against fierce opposition which included Ernest Manning. We will not let them take Canada back to the days when getting sick

could mean financial ruin." "Medicare should continue to be for everyone. It's one of the best things about living in Canada. Don't let them take it away from you. On Oct. 25 think about your family's health care."

## NDP sole supporter of medicare

New Democratic Leader Audrey McLaughlin said she is "shocked" at being the only federal party leader in this election to have signed a declaration to protect medicare.

The Canadian Health Coalition gave every party leader a statement asking them to "ensure the good health of the Canadian people through a strong national health care system." Ms. McLaughlin signed it last week.

"I am especially appalled by Jean Chretien's excuse that he 'does not have the time' to sign this simple pledge," she said. "If that's the kind of commitment Canadian families can expect

on their health care, it points to the urgency of having a strong group of New Democrats in the next Parliament. Who else will make Jean Chretien deliver on his promise to protect medicare?"

The declaration commits signatories to:

- · Stop federal funding cuts to health care;
- · Disallow user fees;
- Enforce the basic principles of the Canada Health Act, including universality; and
- · Repeal the Conservative drug patent law, which increases the cost of pharmaceutical medicines.

"Which of these points made it impossible for Jean Chretien to sign?" Ms.

McLaughlin asked.

"Does he not believe the cost of health care should be shared fairly by Ottawa and the provinces?

"Does he disagree with the view that Canadian consumers should not be ripped off by brand-name drug companies, which charge an average of 45 per cent more for their medicines than generic drug makers?

"Did he promise something to Marc-Yvan Cote, the Quebec health minister who endorsed Mr. Chretien and afterwards said he was convinced that the Liberal Leader would eliminate certain services now offered under the Canada Health Act?"
