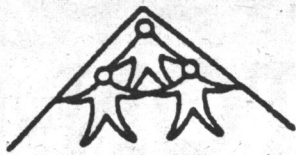


Volunteers' workshop scheduled Tuesday

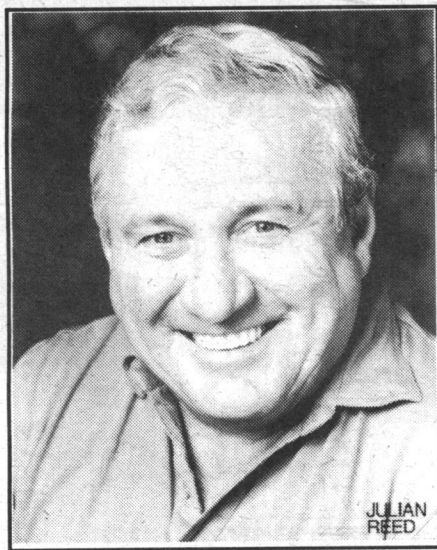

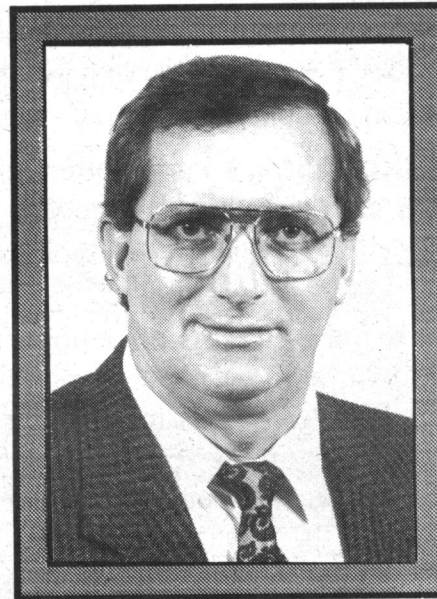
