

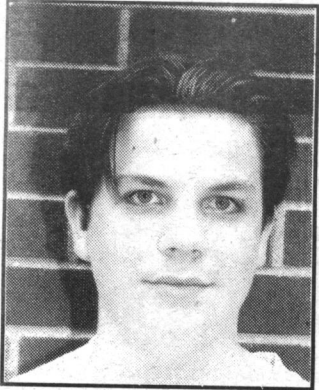

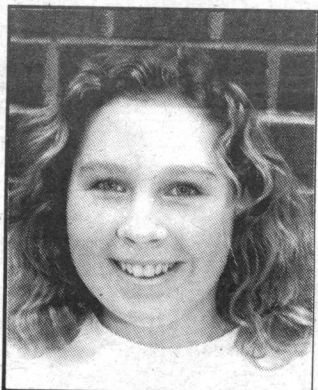

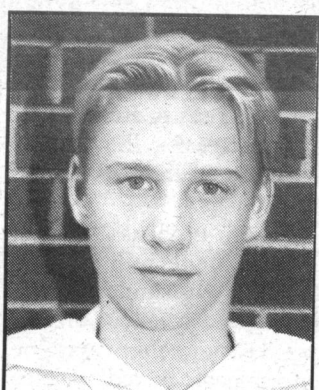
Do you think the Blue Jays will win the World Series?

## How was it invented?

We didn't always have refrigerators, TVs and microwaves. All of these were invented by imaginative people. Find out below how many everyday items and activities came about.

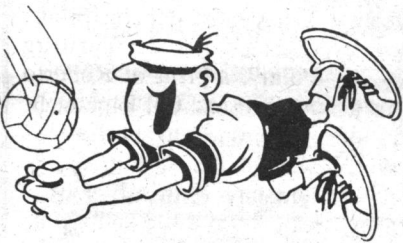
**Tires:** Invented by John Boyd Dunlop in 1888. He was a horse vet and discovered the tire by accident when he tried to attach air-inflated rubber tires to the wheels of his son's bicycle.

**Duplicating machine:** James Watt wanted to increase his business correspondence. In 1773 he invented a machine that reproduced several copies of one document.

**Ball-point pen:** Invented in 1938 by H. Biro. This Hungarian journalist was impressed that ink dried so quickly and decided to try a prototype. He patented this now-essential item in 1943.

**Volleyball:** William G. Moran, an American YMCA athletic instructor, first called the game "Mimonette" when he invented it in 1895.

**Thermometer:** In 1612 the famous astronomer and physicist, Galileo, invented this necessary item. The medical thermometer, however, was invented in 1626 by an Italian physician, Santorius.
