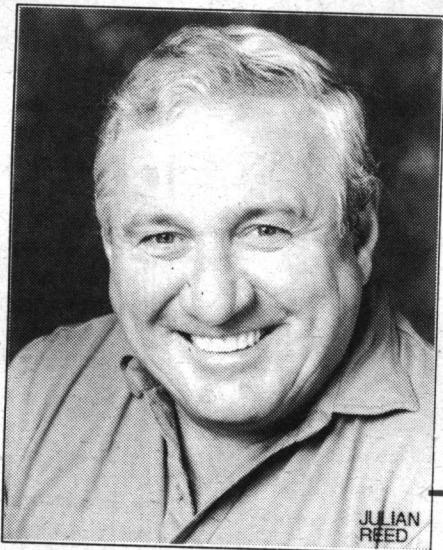

## Rebels - Redmen conquer Kelso

Acton and Georgetown High Schools competed at the Halton Secondary Schools Cross Country Championships at Kelso Conservation Area in Milton Wednesday.

Amanda Bonnell led the Redmen of Acton winning the midget girls 3000-metres in a time of 13:25 while Michael Andrews finished sixth in the midget boys 5000-metres in 19:07.

Georgetown District High School Rebels had a great afternoon placing high in many events.

Roanne Sones and Joanne Taberer came in sixth and seventh respectively in the midget girls 3000-metres in times of 14:41 and 14:53, giving GDHS second overall behind Bishop Reding.

Jill McMenemy was second in the junior girls 4000-metres finishing with a time of 18:57 while Melissa Adams came fourth running the race in 19:25.

Kate Blyth was five seconds behind Adams in fifth, while Ellen Matthews was seventh in a time of 19:55.

With the four top 10 finishes, the Rebels won the junior girls 4000-metres far in front of the rest of the competition.

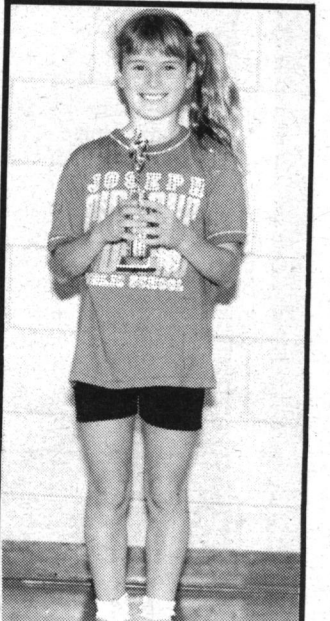
Overall, the GDHS girls finished one point out of first place overall behind Bishop Reding.

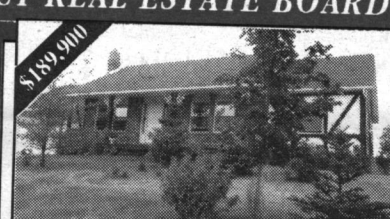

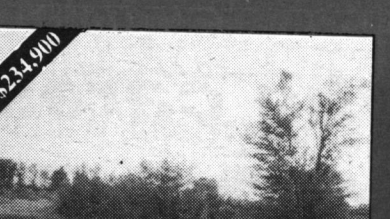
