## Downtown area may get new designation

A proposal to designate the entire Georgetown Business Downtown Improvement Area (BIA) as a historical site was discussed at Monday's Town of Halton Hills general committee meeting.

Councillor Pam Johnston suggested BIA representatives meet with representatives of Heritage Halton Hills to discuss what process would have to be undertaken to implement such a proposal.

"We want to preserve the downtown area to guard against changes which may be forthcoming in the next 10-15 years," she said.

Glen William is currently undertaking a similar process, and Councillor Gail Rutherford pointed out the Glen Williams process may ease the way for a comparable undertaking to take place in Georgetown.

Councillor Norm Elliott, a former member of Heritage Halton Hills, pointed out some businesspeople are strongly opposed to the proposition because of the constraints the designation would entail.

Councillors voted to defer the matter until Monday's council meeting.

## Bank warning

Barbara Halsall, president of P.O.W.E.R. (Protect Our Water and Environmental Resources) asked councillors at Monday's Town of Halton Hills general committee meeting to notify the Royal Bank of its opposition to the bank's potential financing of Reclamation Systems Inc. (R.S.I.), which is involved in the controver**Council Briefs** 

in the Acton Quarry.

The Royal Bank is providing financing to Armbro Enterprises Inc., the parent company of R.S.I. Halsall said investigations had been conducted into the assets of R.S.I., which indicated the company had none. Halsall speculated Armbro Enterprises Inc. was providing R.S.I. with funds to enable the pursuit of the dump site proposal.

Councillor Norm Elliott pointed out Armbro also owns United Aggregates

sial garbage dump proposal and any correspondence to the bank should point out the town was opposed to the R.S.I. proposal.

Councillors supported Halsall's request, but deferred it until Monday's council meeting when it will be voted on.

## Sign up soon

A frustrated Councillor Rick Bonnette demanded to know when the Prospect Park/Acton Arena sign, which had been knocked down, would be replaced. He pointed out he asked the same question a month ago and had not yet received an answer.

Bonnette said outsiders were coming to Acton for hockey games or recreational or figure skating and could not find the arena.

Town Recreation and Parks Department director Tom Shepard assured Bonnette the sign, which has been knocked down for the third time, would be replaced. He said the sign was being upset by trucks driving by and clipping the bottom corner of the sign. Shepard added a new, smaller sign would be made.


