A list of the Fraternal members approved for 1994 has been posted. Dues for Fraternal must be paid by Dec. 31st.

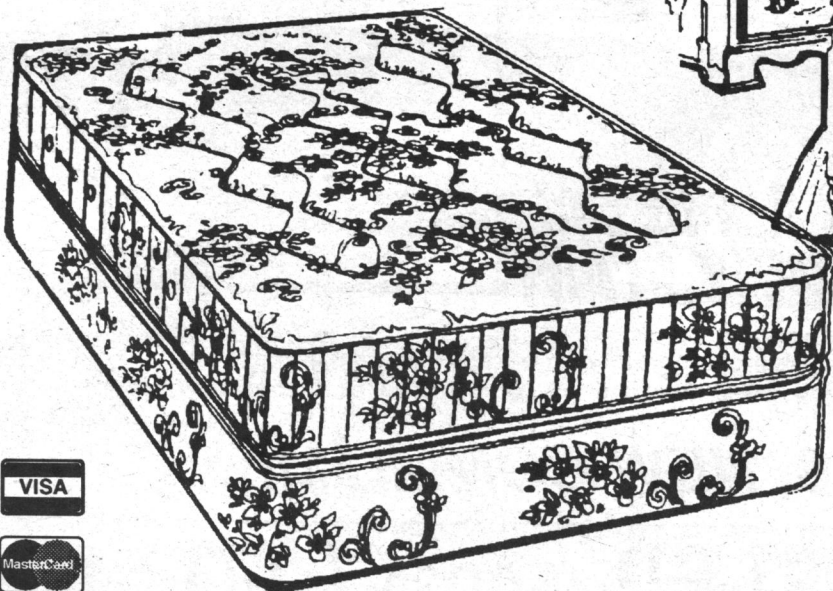
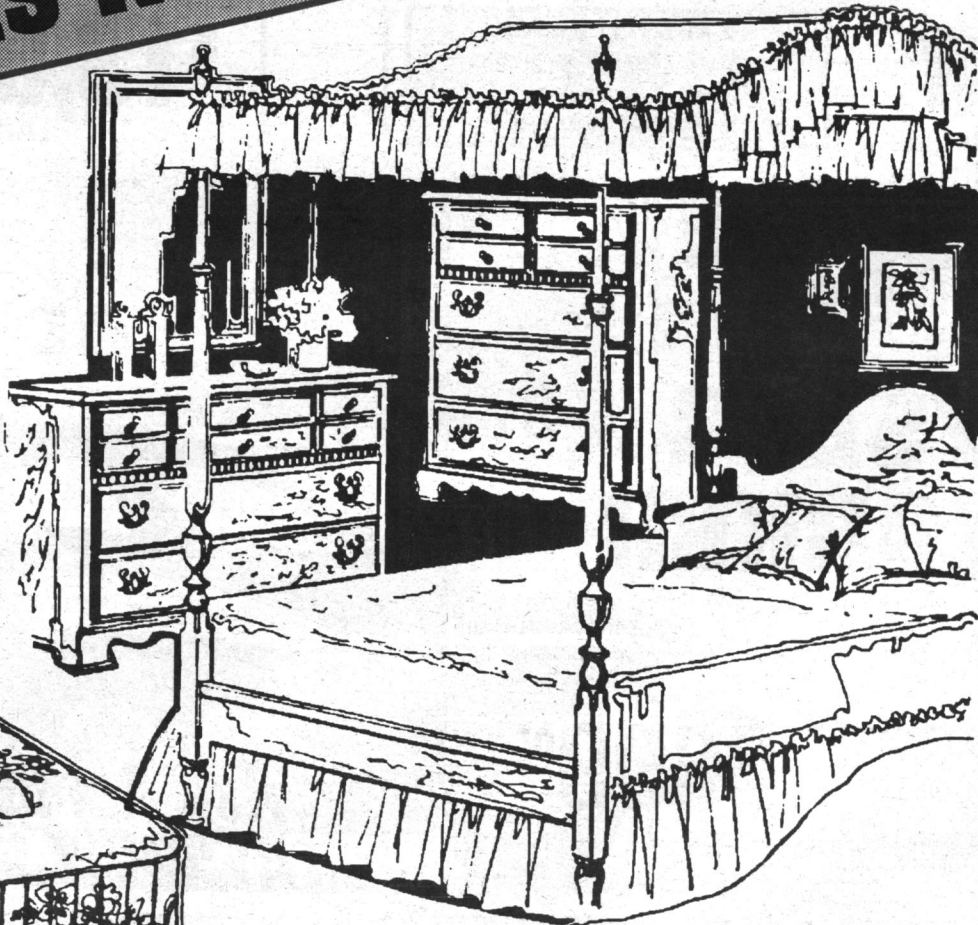
